Following in the footsteps of the Saints . . .

Theodore of Tarsus, Archbishop of Canterbury, 69



Theodore of Tarsus was a Greek-speaking monk and scholar from modern-day Turkey who, at the age of 66, was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by Pope Vitalian. Serving for 22 years, he is widely regarded as the most influential Archbishop of Canterbury between Augustine and Lanfranc. He unified and reformed the early English Church, restructured its diocesan system, and established a renowned school at Canterbury. Theodore is credited with consolidating papal authority in England and is venerated as a saint.
