## October 2025 Church News

Last month saw the return of our regular outreach activities, Y139 and Lighthouse as well as the start of a season of new activities with Shiloh and the Bible course. Both got off to a good start. I was, though, challenged. Challenged by people saying to me, ooh I didn't know about that! If I am honest with you, and it probably showed at the time, I was a bit annoyed. I reflected how we communicate with each other. We share things here in church news, we put things on Facebook, we make announcements in church, yet it seems it is the face to face, one to one invitation that makes a difference. That's no surprise. This month there is so much going on across the parish that I have had to split the dates for your diary across two pages! These things, which people put lots of work into organising are only successful if we all play out part in being not just attentive to what is going on for our own purposes, but also by reaching out and encouraging one another, inviting others on the fringes, our friends and neighbours. Its all about relationships. Communication is at the heart of building relationships, understanding one another, and fostering community. As Christians, we are called to communicate not just with words but with love, grace, and truth. Effective communication is not merely about speaking well but about listening well, showing empathy, and conveying kindness in all our interactions. Good communication helps strengthen the bonds within our church family. It encourages collaboration, resolves misunderstandings, and promotes unity in Christ. Whether it's a conversation with a fellow believer or sharing the Gospel with someone new, our words have the power to uplift or discourage, to heal or hurt. As Proverbs 16:24 reminds us, "Gracious words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones." We should strive to communicate with clarity, honesty, and a spirit of humility. This means taking time to listen, and speaking the truth in love. When we communicate well, we mirror the love of Christ and demonstrate His care for others.

We should never be ashamed to speak about our faith. As Paul boldly declares in Romans 1:16, "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes." Let us commit to cultivating better communication—building relationships grounded in understanding, compassion, and faith. Through thoughtful communication, we can draw closer to one another and to God.
