A LETTER FROM REV. TRACY

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

I'm hoping that we will see an amazing outpouring of mission during our Faith and Fun events that are coming up. By the time you're reading this, we'll have had our chocolate bingo and pizza tea evening, our family fun day and our Songs of Praise across the benefice. These events have been run as part of our parish Renewal Programme and to contribute to the Diocesan Vision 2026, but the reality is that mission is an ongoing, everyday thing, which is the responsibility of us all. Because who doesn't want people to know about Jesus and how he can transform our lives in the way he does?

A few years ago, the following cartoon was in the *Church times*, and it made me smile, because although of course it was intended in a tongue-in-cheek way, it actually reflects the reality for many of those coming to a church for the first time.



Richard and I were worshipping at several different churches before I started with you as vicar, and at one of them, I was roped in on week one, when I was asked to join their choir practically before the service had even ended. But being ignored is just as bad, too! Before we came to Freckleton and Warton, as we moved from Langho, where we were very settled and happy, we had some of those questions from the cartoon, such as 'will I find friends here?', 'will anything odd happen?' going around our minds too. So, what must it be like for those for whom it isn't already a familiar and comfortable environment?

In my last parish, when we moved into the village, we went to the doctors to register. Easy, I thought, I'm an intelligent grown up, I know what to do, and I know where the doctors is, it's the big building on the main road in the village that has a massive doctor's sign on it! But I was totally thrown to find a closed surgery, nobody answering the door, and no information to be found anywhere on the outside of the building as to what on earth was going on. We were soon rescued by a friendly local who pointed us in the direction of Whalley Surgery, as the Langho one had been closed for quite some time! Because, of course, the assumption was that everyone knows the score, so what's the problem? Except they don't... It's the same with church, we need to look at everything from a newcomer's perspective. You know what time the services are without a notice board, they don't. You might know your way around all those fiddly pages in the service book, especially the old BCP books that flip from page to page, but do they? You know what's going on with the children's play areas, where the toilet is, etc.

All of our services, be it Sunday mornings, baptisms, weddings and funerals, are the 'shop window' of the church: first impressions matter lots! That means that every encounter someone has at Holy Trinity or St Paul's has to be one where the quality of welcome and worship is of the highest order, leaving them feeling loved by God and by us, and wanting to come back to experience more. After my licensing service, lots of my friends and clergy colleagues went out of their way to comment on how genuinely and warmly welcomed they felt that night. I find that so encouraging, as it's obvious that those who have felt called to the office of sidesperson take their responsibilities seriously. But it doesn't stop there, it extends beyond the greeting at the front door, and everyone else in church clearly realises the importance of welcome. So, thank you for understanding the importance of this and doing it so well and taking the importance of the furthering of the Kingdom of God seriously and appreciating that it's a task we share together, united in our love for Christ. And I pray that those who heard Bishop Jill speak over the faith and fun weekend or heard the testimonies given at the Songs of Praise event may have had some seeds planted or watered by God so that they may be a step closer to knowing him.

WI NEWS

The September meeting of Freckleton WI was held at the Village Hall on 9 September.

Kathy welcomed everyone and presented a card and plant to Maureen Ashton, to celebrate her 80th birthday.

After the minutes were read, Kathy welcomed Graham Gough, who was here to tell us about *Rivington Gardens, past, present and future*.

He began by showing us all slides of what the gardens looked like when Lord Lever purchased Rivington Hall (formerly known as Roynton) on Winter Hill, near Chorley/Bolton. He paid £60,000 for the hall and hundreds of acres of farmland, and later sold the farmland for £140,000. He didn't want to live in the hall, so he built another house, called Roynton Cottage. This building was mostly wooden (a prefab), except for the brick chimneys.

Lord Lever then hired Thomas Mawson, a principal landscape gardener of the day. Thomas built the Italian Gardens, first with a lake, then Lever's Bridge. All around the gardens there were summerhouses, with steps on either side, going onto the roof of the building, so the many guests of Lord Lever could admire all the scenery.

In 1913, the "cottage" was burnt down by Edith Rigby, a well-known Preston suffragette, who said the cottage was a good target for the suffragette cause. So, Lord Lever built another house (this time made from stone), and this he called "The Bungalow".

Nothing Much happened to the gardens during the First World War, but afterward, miles of paths were built, and a water feature called the Lakeland Raving. Joseph Pulham was the main builder of the ravine tone. He also built the stone gardens on the front of St Anne's. Joseph always used local stone, and invented "pulmanite", which was made up of broken rock and concrete. The header pool for the waterfall was built as a Japanese lake. Lord Lever also built a ruined castle down the side of Rivington Reservoir. He called it Liverpool Castle.

After Lord Lever died, the family (who did not share his love of Rivington) stopped all the spending, and it was sold on. Later on, it was compulsorily purchased by the council, and the Bungalow was pulled down in 1945.

Nature took over for the next 60 years, with lots of rhododendrons. These were removed, because of disease, exposing the structure underneath, and attempts were made to resurrect the gardens.

The Rivington Heritage Trust was founded in 1997 to look after and maintain the gardens, and they received a Lottery Fund grant of £3.4 million. A three-year project followed, employing skilled craftsmen and volunteers, who cleared

the paths. The Pigeon Tower was restored, and visitor information improved. The Lottery Fund ended in 2021, and now they must raise their own funds.

Graham was thanked for his wonderful, informative talk, with members expressing a wish to visit the gardens next year.

The competition, 'A flower for your garden', was won by Heather Edwards, and was followed by a quiz on 'flowers, plants and gardens', devised by Kathy Gemmell

The raffle was drawn, and Kathy wishes everyone good night and a safe journey home.



The Old Vicarage Care Home is situated in an attractive residential area in the quaint village of Freckleton in Lancashire. The home is under new management and has had a recent Care Quality Commission Inspection with a rating of **GOOD** in all areas. The home provides high quality, short, respite and long-term care including day care with bathing service to older people.

The accommodation is provided over two floors, with a variety of daily living spaces for people and their guests to enjoy. Bedrooms are nicely furnished with TV points, a call system and sensor mats. People are encouraged to bring their own furniture to personalise their bedroom. There are communal garden and secure patio areas. People are encouraged to sit outdoors and enjoy the fresh air.

The home is close to local amenities such as chemist, churches – Methodist and Anglican, library, post office, pub, restaurant, shops, and two GP surgeries. There is a bus stop nearby which goes to Preston, Lytham and Blackpool. Food is freshly prepared at the home and people are offered a choice menu throughout the day. People are encouraged to spend quality time with relatives which includes having a freshly prepared meal together. 

Life Christian School began in 1999 in a small village in the state of Andhra Pradesh. The school was created to give children from impoverished backgrounds a good quality Christian education and a chance to break the cycle of poverty. Since then, hundreds of children have benefited from attending the school, enabling them to go on to further education and find good jobs. Today, nearly 200 children attend the school.



Sadly, all this is now in jeopardy. Earlier this year, an engineer's report declared that the building was at risk of collapse after years of harsh weather had damaged its structure. The amazing team at the school quickly found temporary premises so the children's education could continue, but with options limited, this is not suitable for a new permanent base. In the meantime, the old building had to be demolished.



Many children from marginalised communities face discrimination in local government schools and often feel unwelcome. As a result, some fall behind in their studies and may leave school early, which puts them at risk of child labour, child marriage, or trafficking. Life Association is therefore committed to supporting the work and ministry of this amazing school.

Work is now in progress on the foundations of a new purpose-built school, with plans in place for a new structure to be built. However, we can only do this with your help. We urgently need your support to help fund this resurrection miracle! That is why we are launching an appeal this autumn to raise funds for this vital work.
