An example of how one of our congregation from St Albans lives out her faith - Maddie shares her stories of real lives looking for a new start.

Earlier this summer I returned to Calais to volunteer at a refuge for women and children. The house is named after Maria Skobstova, a nun who amongst other things opened her house in Paris to people who needed somewhere to stay, including refugees.

The house in Calais works with other charities and provides short term shelter for people caught up in the many challenges and brokenness of a political border. Each day we did a lot of ordinary things like food shopping, welcoming new guests, clinic appointments, attempting to share games across languages (mostly we ended up with some form of hide and seek that involved a lot of running!)

There's a chapel in the house so we often prayed together. As well as moments of joy there were also sad ones. The women brought stories of trauma, the physical and emotional toll of their journeys and where they had left, came to the surface. Children knew about big boats and small boats.

We all did our best to create times of rest and times of fun but the background noise of choices and onward journeys seeped through. I'm so thankful to the organisations and local people who make the house possible. Whilst issues of immigration are layered and complex, the house is pretty simple. There are beds to sleep in, food to eat, Uno cards to play with and a friendly welcome. It was lovely to be a part of it again.
