

Receiving wine at Holy Communion

At the recent PCC meeting, the method of receiving wine at Holy Communion was discussed. Some people have asked about being able to drink from the common cup instead of receiving a wafer ready-dipped into the wine. From this week the intention is to offer both forms, so there will be an assistant holding the common cup from which to take a sip standing near the clergy member and you will need to indicate which form you wish to receive. You may receive the wafer dipped by the clergy in the wine (intinction), but it is not recommended to dip your own wafer due to potential health risks from fingers contaminating the wine. Please note that Bishop Michael has banned this practice. It is also possible for you to receive in one kind only, ie either wafer or wine. Anglican teaching is that to receive the sacrament in one kind only, is to receive the sacrament in its entirety.
