Use of phone

It has come to my attention that there is a concern about me using my phone during services and meetings.

Please note that on my phone are the notices; the Bible Readings; the Collect and Post Communions for the Day; the music we may be playing through the speakers. Therefore, I need to use my phone!

I also have a register app, so may quickly make a note of who is in church. There are two reasons or this. One - if there is a fire, we will know who should be outside with us; two - if someone hasn't been for a while, I will be able to see a pattern and we can check on them.

I also use it in meetings that are not urgent - I go to Mothers' Union and Monday Group in order to spend time with people - this is mostly during the coffee and chat afterwards. I do not have the luxury of being able to sit and listen to talks that are not urgent, with full attention when I have a lot of emails and admin to respond to. Therefore, I have asked speakers if they mind if I listen and respond to messages at the same time. The talks are not usually giving me information I have to retain but if they are, I may be on my phone making notes. I think most of you understand this. If anyone does have an issue with this, please do speak to ME about it - not in front of a whole group of people, especially when I am not present to explain what I am doing and why. I am trying to see as many people as possible and I think this is a way to do it. *Manda*
