How do me make the most of the time given to us?

In 1982 Stephen King wrote a book called 'Rita Hayworth and the Shawshank Redemption', which was subsequently turned into the film 'The Shawshank Redemption'. In my humble opinion it's one of the best films ever made, and I'm sure many of you will have seen it. It's a story of a man wrongly convicted of murder and sent to prison; I won't give any more of the plot away just in case you've not seen it. But while he's in prison, the main character says a really interesting line. He says this, "Get busy living, or get busy dying". This line has always stuck with me. There are several different ways that one could think about this line. Some use it as a motivational speech, to go and chase after your dreams and goals, to be all you can be, if you keep busy enough, you'll get what you want... and all of that sort of thing. But for me, it encourages us to take a step back and reflect on what we do with our time, and that when we're busy doing, we can almost forget why we are busy doing it in the first place. The Bible doesn't ignore the passage of time and how we use it. Paul writes in Ephesians 5:15-16 savs "Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil. So do not be foolish but understand what the Lord's will is." There is a lot going on in this passage, how do we know what is wise? What 'people' is Paul writing his to? How do me make the most of the time given to us? What does it mean that the days are evil? Who is the Lord and how do we understand what his will is? Some pretty big-ticket questions...

To try and unpack some of these questions we are about to start a mini-sermon series on Sunday mornings, we'll be looking at questions like, why do we have Church? What is it for? What does it mean to pray? What is worship? What do we worship? What do we do with our time when we meet together as a Church, and why do we do the things that we do? What does Church look like outside of Sunday mornings?

If you're a Christian, it's going to be a great opportunity to reflect on what we do with our time together. If you're not a Christian, I invite you to reflect on the words from Ephesians above and to come along to hear about what Church is about. The times and dates are all in this newsletter but do feel free to get in touch.


New Homegroup

You are all very warmly invited to join us on the 21st of September at St Michael's Church, starting at 4pm, as we read aloud the whole Gospel of Matthew.





Martlesham and Brightwell – Parish Giving Scheme

Brightwell PCC has recently joined the Parish Giving Scheme. Martlesham has been a member for a number of years. Instead of giving in cash at one of our churches or setting up a standing order with your bank you can set up a regular payment by direct debit, via the Parish Giving Scheme. This is normally collected at the beginning of each month. Each year PGS will contact you to see if you are happy for your gift to be increased in line with inflation – and you have the choice to review your giving and change it, if you want to. If you are a taxpayer, then the gift aid can be claimed and PGS do this directly from the government.

The advantage for each PCC is the giving and the tax is received regularly each month and without having to complete a Gift Aid tax claim. The same money given but a lot less work for the treasurer. If you would like to join the scheme you can setup a payment by either:

Notes: Groups meet to study the bible together, discuss & share with each other, to worship and pray, for fellowship and to show love & faith through action to others who do not yet know Jesus Christ. Sometimes there are church wide teaching themes, for example, looking at how to be a more fruitful congregation. Groups are places where questions can be asked and difficulties shared in an atmosphere of trust and confidentiality, a place where individuals can be cared for and encouraged in their relationship with God.
