Today's readings are John 1: 6-18 and Genesis 1: 26-2.3

Keith writes...

The Christian faith provides a grand narrative that encompasses life, the universe and everything. According to Genesis it was all created by God and it was good. Human beings were given a special place at the head of the created order. Two things we perhaps do not think about so much occur as I read the Genesis account. The first (and this reflects the thinking of a number of twentieth century theologians) is that it is tempting but probably wrong to read the creation as an effortless expression of God's sovereign power. If we think for a moment about what existed before the creation we must assume it was God himself. Therefore, in order to create the world, God who was all in all, had to, as it were, vacate some space himself. In other words, the creation involved a costly self-limitation for God.

The second point was to consider what God intended in the creation. It is hard to avoid concluding that God intended to live closely with his creation. This became impossible following the coming of sin and death. But God has never given up on this plan. In John we read of a new beginning, the coming of Christ, God entering the world to redeem it and restore the original goal.

What all this means is that the universe is not just a stage set but the costly work of God and that it plays a crucial role in the long term project of creating a space in which God can live with his people. These are all good reasons to value the creation and to live up to the responsibility to care for it.

The PCC would like to thank everyone involved with the Mayor's Civic Service on Sunday. It was well attended and we received many positive comments about the service, the music and the general ambiance. It would not have been possible without the large number of people who gave so much of their time. Amanda Boote was very grateful for all our efforts. We continue to appreciate all the work Terry and Hazel do maintaining our site whilst still performing their sacristan, server and other duties; in addition, thanks to Stuart for working with our broadband provider to ensure we have everything working again!. We are somewhat behind with our charitable giving but have finally decided on the following from our 2024 funds - Emerge Advocacy, Runnymede Dementia Carers Support, Christian Aid (Afghanistan Earthquake), Medecins Sans Frontier (Sudan) and UN World Food Programme (Myanmar). We will be allocating our 2025 money at our October meeting. We are also looking at ways in which we can quickly respond to disasters/emergencies at home or abroad.
