

Launched in 1965, the Away From It All (AFIA) holiday scheme has been at the heart of Mothers' Union's outreach in Britain and Ireland for 60 years. What started as a simple, compassionate idea has grown into one of the most enduring and impactful projects in our movement's history. For six decades, AFIA has responded to families facing financial hardship, trauma, illness, domestic abuse, and overwhelming stress. Tens of thousands of families have been supported, with Mothers' Union groups involved in fundraising, planning and delivering the holidays.

Here are just a few heartwarming stories from across our regions this summer alone:

In **Glasgow and Galway**, 10 mums and 15 children were gifted a holiday at the Field Study Centre on Isla of Cumbrae in July, made possible by our dedicated MU members and volunteers.

The three days away provided great company and lots of laughs, with new friendships formed and memories created. One mum shared "thank you very much from all my heart. You are angels! Also, thanks to God that I'm 100% human! Just wanted to share the impact a couple of days can have." These powerful words a reminder of the impact that even a short break can have on families navigating difficult seasons.

In the **Diocese of Bristol**, MU members took 136 adults and 128 children on an unforgettable day out to Weston-Super-Mare. With four coaches full of excited families, the trip was all about fun, friendship, and making cherished memories. From paddling in the sea to enjoying ice cream in the sun, the day offered families a rare chance to relax and reconnect.

In **Leicester**, 10 families were able to enjoy a much-needed holiday at Haven Mablethorpe. The trip gave parents and children time to unwind, recharge, and create precious memories away from the pressures of daily life. For many of the families attending, it was their first real break in years, providing a time of healing, laughter and restoration. A wonderful way to start the summer holidays.

And it's not just days out and holidays that AFIA can provide. In **North Devon**, the scheme provided funding for a Christian summer camp for children and young people.

None of this would be achievable without the generosity, prayers and tireless work of Mothers' Union members and supporters. The AFIA scheme is a testament to what we can do when we come together to uplift families in need. The dedication over 60 years has made joy possible for generations of families.

In today's world, the need for AFIA is still as urgent as ever, with families caught in the pressures of rising living costs, domestic instability, caring responsibilities and isolation and poverty. A break away from it all isn't a luxury; for some people, it's a lifeline. In a time when rest is often inaccessible to people in vulnerable situations, AFIA reminds people that they are seen, valued and loved.

Heavenly Father, bless the homes in our parish, especially those where there is anxiety and sorrow. We cannot ask that we be spared from difficulty and temptations, but we ask that both parents and children may in the experience of your grace, be strengthened in their faith, and grow as your loyal servants, through Christ our Lord. Amen



Pause for Thought with Norma Fox

No fishing allowed

Corrie ten Boom was a remarkable woman. She shared with us, in her books, many of her thoughts and experiences. Holocaust survivor Corrie ten Boom knew the importance of forgiveness.



In her book, Tramp for the Lord, she says her favourite mental picture was of forgiven sins thrown into the sea. 'When we confess our sins to God, He casts them into the deepest ocean, gone forever I believe God then places a sign out there that says No Fishing Allowed.'

She points to an important truth that believers in Jesus can sometimes fail to grasp – when God forgives our wrongdoing, we're forgiven fully! We don't have to keep dredging up our shameful deeds, wallowing in any mucky feelings. Rather we can accept His grace and forgiveness, following Him in freedom.

We see this idea of 'no fishing allowed' in Psalm 160. The psalmist proclaims that although God is just, He forgives the sins of those who repent: 'But with you there is forgiveness' (v4). As the psalmist waits for God, putting his trust in Him (v5) he states in faith that He 'Himself will redeem Israel from all their sins' (v8). Those who believe will find 'full redemption' (v7).

When we're caught in feelings of shame and unworthiness, we can't serve God with our whole hearts. Instead, we're restricted by our past. If you feel stymied by the wrong you've done, ask God to help you fully believe in His gift of forgiveness and new life. He's cast your sins into the ocean! God wants you to allow His forgiveness to set you free!

Dear Lord and Father of mankind Forgive our foolish ways!
Reclothe us in our rightful mind, In purer lives thy service find, In deeper rev'rence praise, In deeper rev'rence praise.



Book Review from Mara

When Prayer Doesn't Work – Reimagining our understanding and expectations of prayer by Margaret Somerville



Prayer. Is it about having the right words, using the right formula, sitting in the right pew? Are our prayers only heard if we stick to the tradition we know?

How do we reconnect when we are in a season of silence from heaven, and longing for prayer that nourishes us, rather than sitting in the disappointment of unanswered prayers?

Margaret Somerville is an interfaith minister who has lifelong connections with Iona, and uses her engagement in prayerful traditions to reimagine the presence of ordinary life as prayerful acts.

She shows through six pathways: sacred space, release, naming, wilderness, nourishment and peace – that we can find holiness in daily life.

Church Finances for 2025

For the last few years, I have been providing details monthly of the income and expenditure on the general account only. This account pays most of the church expenses including gas, electricity, insurance and clergy housing and other expenses. Therefore, this report for 2024 and 2025, now includes income and expenditure on all accounts **including fabric fund, and investments.**

Income

January 2025 income included £15,000 from the estate of Paul Nener. Feb 2024 included £40k in Legacies. April 2025 includes £2469 tax relief and £11649 bank interest, May 2025 includes £5,602 in bank interest, July includes £10,194 in bank interest.

Expenditure

Expenditure is currently running about £3.4k more than the same time in 2024, mainly due to the reduction in the Parish Share, and the cost of roof repairs to the clergy vestry.

Many regular donations are now either through the Parish giving scheme or through other electronic means which means less visits to the bank and less cost to the church as banking cash and cheques incur additional charges. Thank you for those who are now using these methods, If anyone would like to know more about how to donate or about the church finances please see me.
