REFLECTIONS......REV. ROBERT SIMPSON

Hi all

I trust you have all had a good summer and are looking forward to what the Lord has in store for us this autumn.

We live in troubled times with deep divisions in our society. This is a challenge for us as we are called to be peacemakers and reconcilers.

I would like to share some thoughts about our Gospel reading, Luke 15:3-7, the lost sheep. This is a familiar and much loved parable but I was struck by some observations by theologian Paula Gooder. She sets the scene that this was a very rich shepherd, as most of Jesus' hearers would have either been manual labourers with a few sheep who they would have taken to pasture during the day and put them with all the other sheep at night, guarded by one of them. They would know all their sheep by name and their sheep would recognise their voice.

The shepherd in the story was very different from them and would not be expected to look after his own sheep. Losing a sheep is bad enough but then to leave the 99 was pure stupidity risking the loss of many other sheep to robbers and predators. The listeners would have been amazed or amused.

Yet the punch line is God's care for each individual. God will risk everything for the one. Of course the cost to God was the death of His Son.

In a world where there seems so little care and outsiders are feared, we are challenged and empowered to receive God's love in order to reach out as channels of His love, both as individuals and the church.
