Some Reflections on Creation Care this Harvest Season
As followers of Christ, we are called to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbour as ourselves. This love is not confined to our relationships with other people. It extends to the whole created order, the earth that God declared "very good" in Genesis, and this included the varied and complex weave of creation where everything works together in an ordered beauty that reflects God's intention and glory (Psalm 19). In our modern world, where the natural world is under unprecedented strain, caring for creation is not just a good idea — it is a very real part of Christian discipleship.

One voice that has been drawing attention to this in recent years is the writer and activist Paul Kingsnorth (quite a character but worth a read!). Formerly a prominent environmental campaigner and co-founder of the Dark Mountain Project, Kingsnorth has wrestled deeply with what it means to respond faithfully to the ecological crises of our time. Through his journey of trying to discover

spiritual meaning, which involved some time as a Buddhist and then a pagan, he eventually gave up on these and after an encounter with Christ in a cave in southern Ireland he dramatically turned to the Christian faith, and as such his reflections have a striking prophetic resonance for us as a church.

Kingsnorth reminds us that creation is not a mere "resource" to be managed but a sacred gift to be revered. He writes about the dangers of seeing the world purely in terms of utility — what we can extract, produce, or consume. This mindset, he argues, has led us to strip-mine not only the earth's soil and forests but also our own souls of their worth and meaning as God's children. When we forget that the world is a gift, we fall into idolatry — worshipping growth,

consumption, and technological power rather than the Creator.

This insight is profoundly biblical. Psalm 24 declares, "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it." Our role is not that of owners but of stewards, caretakers entrusted with God's good world. In Genesis, humanity is placed in the garden "to work it and take care of it." This is not an invitation to exploit but a command to serve. Creation care, then, is not an optional "green hobby" for a few, it is at the heart of our vocation as God's people. What does this mean for us practically as a church community? It begins with cultivating a spirit of gratitude. When we thank God for the rain, the harvest, and the beauty of a sunrise, we remember that all of life is gift. Gratitude opens the door to responsibility — we

cannot thank God for creation and then treat it carelessly.

It also calls us to make choices that reflect God's heart for justice. Environmental harm often impacts the poor most severely, with polluted water, rising food prices, and extreme weather striking hardest at those with the least protection. Caring for creation is therefore an act of loving our neighbours, near and far. Kingsnorth has warned that we cannot save the world by the same mindset that has damaged it, endless growth and domination. Instead, he calls for humility, slowness, and a return to the sacred as discovered in the truth of the Bible and Jesus Christ. As Christians, we recognize this as repentance: turning away from ways that harm creation and turning toward Christ, who reconciles "all things, whether on earth or in heaven" (Colossians 1:20). This season of harvest let us worship God with renewed awe for the world He has made, remembering that caring for creation is caring for the place where His glory dwells. Together, may we learn to walk gently on the earth, honouring the Creator by cherishing His creation.

Finance Update for July and August

Sorry had a very busy August so did not send out July Figures. So these are July and August figures .

Total income for July and August was £11,989.87 Total expenditure for July and August was £13,628.30

That is a difference of -£1638.43

If you compare this to last year's figures our income is down by about £1,000 over these 2 months, and if you compare May and June's income to July and August it was about £500 less each month.

Also our expenses are up by about £1,500 from last 2 months as well.

Please keep praying for our income to be higher than our expenditure come the end of the year.

On a very positive note, direct giving (mainly through the Parish Giving Scheme) is up by about £3,000 compared to last year's figures.

If this stays at this level of income, then members of the church that are directly giving through their tithing, will be double what we had set in the budget at the beginning of the year.

So thanks be to God.
