CCWW CARBON FOOTPRINT 2024

In 2024, our total carbon footprint was 25.24 tCO₂ A small reduction compared to 2023, but a good start as there were increased visitors to the church & hall and hours of use in 2024. We have offset our carbon footprint by paying £631 to Climate Stewards who are a Christian charity. The money is used to stop the production of the same amount of CO₂ as we've produced by funding projects such as water filters & solar cook stoves instead of burning fossil fuels. CCWW has a plan to reduce our carbon footprint year-on-year. Why not measure your carbon footprint and see where you could cut down your CO₂ emissions?

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians.

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death — even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
