It is a remarkably special space in the middle of an urban area, and both local residents and people with family memorials there really do appreciate the way the church looks after it.

NOTES ON A GREEN THEME

Have you heard of The Happy News paper? Created by designer and illustrator Emily Coxhead who, at 22, wanted to create a newspaper that caught and shared all the happy and uplifting bits of news out there and so combat the sense of doom and gloom that was constantly emanating from the broadsheets and tabloids. Ten years later The Happy News is still going and has at least 20,000 subscribers from all over the world.

Who can resist a smile when reading about thousands of Wimbledon tennis balls being donated each year to The Wildlife Trusts who turn them into homes for harvest mice? Or that a record breaking 211 nightjars – which were once pretty near extinct – were counted on the RSPB nature reserves in 2024, due to the decade of work by reserve teams, volunteers and supporters restoring the low heathland habitats that nightjars favour. Or that conservation projects, led by Natural England, have supported the recovery of 150 species according to findings published this August. Successes include a chough chick hatching in Kent for the first time in 200 years and a hawksbeard mining bee being spotted for the first time in a century in Hastings.
