St Francis of Assisi - love for the Creation

St Francis (1181 - 1226) is surely one of the most attractive and best-loved of all the saints. But he began by being anything but a saint. Born the son of a wealthy cloth-merchant of Assisi, Francis' youth was spent in fast-living, parties and on fast horses as a leader of the young society of the town. Then he went to the war between Assisi and Perugia, and was taken prisoner for a year. By the time of his release, Francis had changed. Perhaps his own suffering had awakened him to that of others. In any case, he abandoned warfare and carousing, and began to help the poor and the lepers of his area. Then one day a voice which seemed to come from the crucifix in the small, semi-derelict church of Damiano Assisi 'Go and repair my house, which you see is falling down'.

This religious experience was a vital turning point in Francis' life: Jesus Christ became very real and immediate to him. His first action was to begin repairing the church, having sold some of his father's cloth to pay for materials. His father was not amused, in fact he was furious - until Francis renounced his inheritance and even his clothes by his dramatic stripping off in the public square of the town. The Bishop of Assisi provided him with simple garments, and Francis began his new life.

His inspiration was always religious, not social, and the object of his quest was always the Crucified Christ, not Lady Poverty for her own sake. Francis rebuilt San Samiano, and then travelled as a pilgrim. His compassion for the poor and lepers became famous. Soon disciples joined him, and they set up a communal life in simple wattle and daub huts. They went on occasional preaching tours. (Not until later did they become an Order whose theologians won fame in the Universities.)

In 1219 Francis visited the Holy Land, and his illusions about the Crusaders were shattered. He went on to seek out the Sultan, and tried to convert him. Back home, he found his Order was now 5,000 strong, and growing. Francis stepped down as head, but continued to preach and was immensely popular. He died after a prolonged illness at the age of 45, and was canonised in 1228. Francis' close rapport with the animal creation was well known. The story of his preaching to the birds has always been a favourite scene from his life. He also tamed the wolf of Gubbio. This affinity emphasises his consideration for, and sense of identity with, all elements of the physical universe, as seen in his Canticle of the Sun. This makes him an apt patron of nature conservation. The 20th century witnessed a widespread revival of interest in Francis. Sadly, some films and books caricatured him as only a sentimental nature-lover or a hippie drop out from society. This ignores the real sternness of his character, and his all-pervasive love of God and identification with Christ's sufferings, which alone make sense of his life. Two ancient, and many modern English churches are dedicated to him.

Hello, my name is John and I work for **South Eastern Railway**. I would like to let you know what has been happening at Sole Street Railway Station over the last year. Many of you will remember Jan, who worked in the ticket office and who was passionate about her gardening and plants.

After she retired, the station became unloved and somewhat tired. Last year, I had to pop to Sole street to complete a task and I decided I wanted to smarten it up.

At the same time, the company was promoting "South Eastern in Bloom', a company initiative to brighten up our stations and encourage wildlife to thrive.

I offered to get involved and asked if I could do something with Sole St. Bev the station manager, was fully supportive and encouraged me to take the reins and get started.

I started by removing the damaged wooden planters and pots.

I relocated most of the pots around the platform and added a lovely half barrel.

Most of the plants and flowers I have planted are perennials and with a bit of love and care, should continue to flourish.

Also added to the entrance to the platform are wildflowers to bring the pollinators to the area.

All of this would not be possible without the team that has assisted and that brings me onto my next chapter of the story.

The stations from Rochester as far up to Farningham Road are maintained by a couple of fantastic colleagues that we call line cleaners.

They move from station to station cleaning the platforms and facilities. Not only that, but they water the plants for us each day when needed.

They also notify Rochester of any issues at the stations so we can act accordingly. I hope you agree that the station looks so much more presentable and tidier.

These colleagues are very approachable and if anyone needs any assistance when they are there, please don't hesitate to reach out to them.

It is a real pleasure to collaborate with the community and I look forward to meeting the residents when I am at the station to have a chat.

BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

It was a beautiful June day for the King's Official Birthday and also for a ringing tour organised by the Rochester District of the Kent County Association of Change Ringers. Through the kindness of Nick and Anita, driver and navigator and both Rochester Cathedral ringers, it was off to Essex and Hertfordshire.

Stansted Mountfitchet is near Stansted Airport and the encircling roads, car parks, hotels and warehouses spread ever closer. The roaring MII runs nearby. The Stansted Hall Estate is now a residential college for the Spiritualist movement and the estate church well cared for by the Churches Conservation Trust. Volunteers were working hard in the extensive churchyard with many gravestones and Giant Redwood trees.

We climbed the wooden ladder in the church tower up to the ringing room to ring the 8 bells (tenor 13cwt) with the oldest bell cast in 1540. They are an anticlockwise ring so you must remember to look <u>left</u> when starting ringing the standard rounds (lightest to heaviest bell) which starts and ends all ringing.

Then on just into Hertfordshire to Bishop's Stortford where today a large multistory car park, Sainsbury's and shopping malls are crammed in by the River Stort. How different when the family came down from Lochwinnoch, Renfrewshire and my Grandpa Millar was the vet with a pony and trap and Mallow the Jersey cow who provided the family with rich creamy milk.

Walking up Windhill the old town survives with its large 15th century church. But here there is change too for the upper part of the tower and the spire were added in 1812. Inside the tower there is also change for though the oldest bell the 7th was cast in 1713 five new bells were cast by the bell foundry Royal Eijsbouts in 2022. This Dutch firm was founded in 1872 as a 'factory for tower clocks'. Since 1947 they have also cast church bells and bells for carillons. For the 850th anniversary of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris the existing bells were restored and a new set of bells cast. Also with a French foundry Royal Eijbouts cast some of the new bells including the largest 'Marie' weighing 6 tons. Through the bravery of the French firemen the cathedral's west towers and their bells survived the later devastating fire which the cathedral suffered.

Today in this Hertfordshire parish church there is now a full cathedral like ring of 12 bells (tenor 15cwt). Weaving your own bell correctly amongst so many bells and watching closely a forest of ropes and bobbing coloured woollen sallies takes considerable skill and concentration.

Next to Hatfield Heath where, sitting on a bench eating a sandwich, the village cricket match was enjoyed in the sunshine and behind us the little Victorian church awaited our visit.

To St Luke, whose feast-day is 18th October, we owe a beautifully written gospel as well as the Book of Acts. He was a Greek physician and faithful travelling companion to St Paul. Under house arrest near the end of his life Paul noted, 'only Luke is with me'. Luke's gospel focuses on the compassion of Christ, and offers us moving parables, such as the Good Samaritan and Prodigal Son. Women figure more prominently in Luke's gospel than in any other: look out for the extended story of the Virgin Birth, and stories of Mary, Elizabeth, and the woman who was a sinner. His gospel also features more poor people, more lepers, more 'sinners', who are all shown to be 'inside' the love of Christ. In Acts, Luke skilfully links sacred and profane history, as subsequent archaeology has shown. He tells of how the early Christians moved away from lerusalem into the pagan world, and especially on to Rome.
