²¹ Stupid people are happy with their foolishness, but the wise will do what is right.


²² Get all the advice you can, and you will succeed; without it you will fail.

You are part of the Family Service!

One of the signs of a healthy family is that the generations enjoy getting together - grandparents, aunts and uncles can enjoy seeing children growing up - and can play silly games with them! Grandchildren and children can enjoy listening to stories and wisdom from their elders. The different generations may not actually live with each other - but regular get-togethers and plans (and exhausted parents hope for a meal that they don't have to prepare!). So it is with a health church family - God is more fully represented when all generations of a church family are able worship together.

A group of us have come together to try to inject some fresh energy and ideas into the family service which is on the 1st Sunday of the month at 10.30am in Melford, and 4pm in Lawshall. We're thinking about how to encourage people of all generations to play a part in the service. We've thought about music - we want to make sure that children learn from our rich heritage of hymns ... but also that they can engage with more contemporary music (see next article!). We've also thought about the intimacy we have enjoyed during services in the Lady Chapel and south aisle. Accordingly, we are planning to take our life into our hands(!) and encourage people to sit together closer towards the front for the family service at Holy Trinity in November. We also have some other ideas to trial - some of these may work, some may not! (we will similarly try to give notice).

It is a matter of urgency that church in this nation is as welcoming as possible for new families. More seriously we should reflect on the very words of Jesus who said in Mark 10:15: "Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." Indeed, personally I regularly find that I learn more walking with God from a simple talk than I do from a more complex sermon.

So, if you are not going to Evensong on the first Sunday at 6.30pm, please consider strengthening both yourself and the church family and coming along to the family service ... or both! I pray that you will be blessed.




Letter of Complaint about a modern hymn(!)

Collect (prayer for the day)

Almighty God, whose only Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence: give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading 2 Corinthians 4:1-6

- 1 Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart. 2 Rather, we have renounced secret and shameful ways; we do not use deception, nor do we distort the word of God. On the contrary, by setting forth the truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. 3 And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing.

6 But godliness with contentment is great gain. 7 For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. 8 But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. 9 Those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. 10 For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

11 But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses. 13 In the sight of God, who gives life to everything, and of Christ Jesus, who while testifying before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you 14 to keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, 15 which God will bring about in his own time—God, the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords, 16 who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light, whom no one has seen or can see. To him be honour and might forever. Amen.

17 Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

18 Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. 19 In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life.

Old Testament Reading

Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15

- ¹ This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord in the tenth year of Zedekiah king of Judah, which was the eighteenth year of Nebuchadnezzar. ² The army of the king of Babylon was then besieging Jerusalem, and Jeremiah the prophet was confined in the courtyard of the guard in the royal palace of Judah.
- 3 Now Zedekiah king of Judah had imprisoned him there, saying, "Why do you prophesy as you do? You say, 'This is what the Lord says: I am about to give this city into the hands of the king of Babylon, and he will capture it.
- ⁶ Jeremiah said, "The word of the Lord came to me: ⁷ Hanamel son of Shallum your uncle is going to come to you and say, 'Buy my field at Anathoth, because as nearest relative it is your right and duty to buy it.'
- 8 "Then, just as the Lord had said, my cousin Hanamel came to me in the courtyard of the guard and said, 'Buy my field at Anathoth in the territory of Benjamin. Since it is your right to redeem it and possess it, buy it for yourself.'
- "I knew that this was the word of the Lord; 9 so I bought the field at Anathoth from my cousin Hanamel and weighed out for him seventeen shekels of silver. 10 I signed and sealed the deed, had it witnessed, and weighed out the silver on the scales. 11 I took the deed of purchase—the sealed copy containing the terms and conditions, as well as the unsealed copy—12 and I gave this deed to Baruch son of Neriah, the son of

Mahseiah, in the presence of my cousin Hanamel and of the witnesses who had signed the deed and of all the Jews sitting in the courtyard of the guard.

"In their presence I gave Baruch these instructions: 14 'This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says: Take these documents, both the sealed and unsealed copies of the deed of purchase, and put them in a clay jar so they will last a long time. 15 For this is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says: Houses, fields and vineyards will again be bought in this land.'

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you, O Lord

- ¹⁹ "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day.²⁰ At his gate was laid a beggar named Lazarus, covered with sores ²¹ and longing to eat what fell from the rich man's table. Even the dogs came and licked his sores.
- ²² "The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried. ²³ In Hades, where he was in torment, he looked up and saw Abraham far away, with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴ So he called to him, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this fire.'
- ²⁵ "But Abraham replied, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, while Lazarus received bad things, but now he is comforted here and you are in agony. ²⁶ And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been set in place, so that those who want to go from here to you cannot, nor can anyone cross over from there to us.'
- ²⁷ "He answered, 'Then I beg you, father, send Lazarus to my family, ²⁸ for I have five brothers. Let him warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.'
- 29 "Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them listen to them.'
- 30 "'No, father Abraham,' he said, 'but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.'
- ³¹ "He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'"
