Season of Creation at Earley St Peter's

The Season of Creation is the period in the Church calendar from 1 September to 4 October (which is St Francis' Day). The season is dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life.


The concept of this season, also called Creationtide, was first introduced by the late Ecumenical Patriarch, Demetrios I, in 1989,



and 'Churches Together in Britain and Ireland' adopted the concept in 2008.

For Season of Creation 2025, the Church has chosen the theme 'peace with creation', inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18. Given the situation in Gaza, Ukraine, Sudan, and other parts of the world, the effects of climate change, and the need for an energy transition, remembering God's amazing gift and our role within it is very timely.

Creationtide at Earley St Peter's will be reflected in worship, through various events, and an Art Exhibition featuring creation-inspired works by our very own curate Revd Kajsa. Kajsa will preach at both services on 14 September about two large pieces of art, one of which is being 'created' specifically for this exhibition, and we will include a few other of her pieces in church for the duration of Creationtide (including the one shown below). She will also develop a brochure for her artwork that can be picked up at the back of the church.

To give people more opportunity to visit this exhibition, from Monday 8 September to Saturday 4 October, church will be open every day from 9am-12.30pm (with the exception of 10-11am on Wednesdays when Tots & Teddies is taking place, and 25 September and 2 October).

Further to this, Julia Jones will be helping us to explore the theme of Creation through Godly Play on Sunday 7 September in the homily at the 6.30pm Evening Worship service. Julia has previously visited our PCC to

explore the Lord's Prayer through Godly Play and it was both thoughtprovoking and well received.

There are also some new features in our churchyard which have been set up to coincide with the arrival of Creation Season and will continue to develop. Sarah Godwin has worked hard to develop a strategy for encouraging and protecting the natural wildlife in our churchyard, and so far we have seen the construction of the Children's Church area, with bug hotels and log piles. There are also new bird baths and bird houses to be installed, as well as some guides to which birds you may be able to see in our local area. In the near future, Sarah will be sharing more of the plans for the churchyard and how people can get involved.

Finally, we are hoping to have Morning Prayer outdoors on Wednesdays in September, from 10 September onwards (although this will be weather permitting!). Seating will be available for these services.

We are all part of God's wonderful creation, each made in his image and loved beyond measure. We are also all part of God's wider creation, and not only do we have a responsibility to care for our world, but we are also to celebrate its beauty and complexity. Our hope is that this season will be an opportunity to renew a sense of awe and wonder for all God has created, and to inspire us all to find new ways to help preserve and protect our world.

13 September, 10am to 6pm: Ride and Stride.



Records of burials in our

churchyard: We have undertaken extensive work to update the records of burials in our churchyard. As part of this, we aimed to have the records in a format that can be accessed by the general public. We're pleased to report that these records are now available via our web site here. We hope that this will be a great help to local historians and people researching their family history.
