'Meteorological Autumn' started this week, as I write this at the very beginning of September. And it shows — right now it is 'blowing a hoolie' (as my mother used to say) and pouring with rain. We were already picking blackberries in early August this year, and as I walked up to the church in the wind this morning, conkers were already falling around me. 

Soon after that will come acts of Remembrance when we thank those who paid so dearly for our freedom. And then, still in the distance but it will soon approach, Advent and Christmas when we thank God for the gift of the Christ-child, full of peace and joy.

As we go into autumn, I encourage you to find the warmth of fellowship in our churches and groups as we gather Sunday by Sunday and week by week to worship God with thankful hearts. May this autumn be a time of fruitfulness and blessing for us all. I close with words of promise from the Old Testament:

The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. (Lamentations 3:22-23 ESV)
