Today's readings are **Hebrews 13.1-8, 15-16** and **Luke 14.1, 7-14**

Clive writes...

This has been the first year I've tried to run an allotment, albeit a small one. We've now reached the stage of collecting the main harvest. Some things have grown remarkedly well, the strawberries, onions and potatoes were good and the parsnips look promising but others including the carrots and cabbages have been very poor — I have a lot to learn. It is a great pleasure to eat something you have grown, somehow it tastes better, but perhaps the greatest pleasure is obtained by swapping produce with fellow gardeners or just giving stuff away as it is usual to end up with more than you can eat and storage is often a problem. That thought resonates well with the last verse of our Epistle reading this Sunday (Hebrews 14.1-8,15-16). "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God."

That verse sums up much of what is necessary to live a Christian life. Doing good whenever you can and sharing resources with those less fortunate and doing these things to the glory of God. Our Gospel reading teaches us humility and of course there are many other suggestions as to how we lead our lives in the light of Christ's teaching. But that verse from the Letter to the Hebrews gives simple directions that we can all endeavour to follow, sometimes it is well worth keeping things simple. 'Do good and share' simple instructions that cover a great deal of what we should be aiming to do, we could use it as our motto. There was however a sting in the tail of that verse – remember it ended, "for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." Swapping veg and fruit and giving away surplus is hardly a sacrifice. Should we not go further?
