FROM THE LEADERSHIP TEAM ~

Hello!

It's been such a joy to come back to work this past week and see your lovely faces! I look forward to catching up with more of you in the weeks to come. Today's reading from 1 Timothy is a pastoral letter from the Apostle Paul, to Timothy. A significant element of this passage is Paul explaining his own sin. He doesn't shy away from his past, instead he reminds Timothy that he was 'a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence'. But through the grace and mercy that can be found in Christ Jesus, he was transformed.

So, what does this mean? We know that Jesus paid the ultimate price for our sins and God's abundant grace has the power to transform the hearts and minds of even the worst sinners. This freedom from sin is available to us. Through belief in Jesus and true repentance, He wipes the slate clean. He carries the cost of our sins and bares our shame. We are forgiven. The King of Kings calls us His own. He is our Living Hope.

We are also reminded of sin in our Gospel reading. Jesus welcomed in the sinners and sat and ate with them, much to the dismay of the Pharisees and scribes. He didn't care about being liked, he cared about the sinners. Jesus sees our true inner self and we are all welcomed by Christ. But because we are all welcomed by Christ, we have to honour Him in that, confess our sins and work to always be in relationship with him.

My prayer for you all for this week is that you don't feel weighed down by your sin - past or present - but that you take it to the foot of the Cross. That you leave it at the feet of Jesus and remember just how great the love of God is.

Luke 15:7 - 'I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance'.

1 Timothy 1, 12 - 17

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

LUKE 15, 1 - 10

All the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near Jesus to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.

'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'
