"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life" (Matthew 6 25-27)

CLERGY THOUGHTS

For hardship does not spring from the soil, nor does trouble sprout from the ground. Yet man is born to trouble as surely as sparks fly upward. Job 5:5-7

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you 1 Peter 5:7

Scripture tells us that trouble is part and parcel of the human experience and that is one reason why we are encouraged to turn to God in prayer and particularly in troubled times. Whether dealing with personal struggles or feeling overwhelmed by the sufferings and evils of the world, prayer is both the calling and comfort of those who long to see the kingdom of God active in the world.

So many of us struggle with prayer, even with the plethora of resources designed to embed regular daily prayer into our lives. I found these thoughts from Charles Ringama, a Christian author and philosopher, describe some of the real obstacles to faithful, sustained prayer, along with his own honest experience of prayer.

They encouraged me and I hope they will encourage you.

'Sometime faltering, sometimes the quick step'

I have always found the spiritual discipline of prayer to be one of my greatest challenges. This is because it has been such an up-and-down, ambivalent, perplexing and at other times exhilarating, powerful and transformative experience. I have also found it to be just plain hard work with seemingly little benefit or fruit. There have also been times when I have stopped saying prayers. Here I resonate with Merton's observations, 'we have to learn



patience in the weary and arid path that takes us through dry places in prayer'. This is not to say that I always had the patience, not did I realise it was a path. More often not during these times, I felt hopelessly lost.

But in a seemingly strange contradiction, I can say that I have never stopped praying even when there were times when I had stopped saying prayers. For when I have faltered and my lips have fallen silent, there was still a cry of the heart.'

In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. Romans 8:26



PSALMING UP!

As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?

Are you 'at your wit's end' and ready to 'bite the dust'? Or ready to 'run the race' with joy and gladness 'for His steadfast love endures for ever!' ... familiar phrases from the Book of Psalms - our go to treasury of wisdom and words that help us meet most circumstances that hamper or enhance our path.

As much as this book of Wisdom is precious to us it is likely that we have our favourite parts that have helped us through various experiences in life, and that our use of them may not spread too far from those. We may have great memories of chanting psalms at Mattins or Evensong or found it most infuriatingly baffling thing to do! And, of course, great texts such as 'The Lord is my shepherd' find great foothold and expression in various forms across the whole experience of life and death.

'God is present in every corner of his creation - everywhere and with us whatever we do. Within this he chooses to relate with us in special ways, in certain places, and makes himself known at certain times -

often particular times of intimate and awe-filled encounters, which demand human response and worshipful prayer.'

Most of all 'the Psalms give us a language in a two-way conversation with God. Words that help God meet men and women in a special way in which he can coax, love, challenge, chastise, and we can praise, complain, protest, wonder, express angst and despair. This conversational language between God and his people is called to be direct, intense, intimate, and above all, honest'.

The Psalms appeal to the whole person and demand a total response - they inform our intellect, direct our wills and stimulate our imagination - the result being we come away changed. They allow us to take our joys, our frustrations and angers, our questions and paradoxes to God — to whisper, to speak, to sing, and sometimes shout and rage at Him — to allow us to be who we are as we voice them out to him. The psalms will often help us and give us the words we need to take to God when we are lost for words ourselves.

The Psalms, which were usually memorized by God's people, were the go-to texts of the first disciples, and through them, saw fulfilled promises of their Messiah. We may unwittingly (or not) sing many metrical versions of psalms in our familiar hymns.


In these challenging, fragile and unstabling days, it is a good time to revisit these ancient poems and songs of wisdom – to strengthen our faith, find God in new ways, and be reassured of his love for us. There is such great variety amongst the 150 (or so) Psalms which were written over a 1,000-year period and collected and structured so carefully into the set we have today.

To see the different collections within the book and understand a little how Hebrew poetry works leads us to greater depths of meaning and connection. To understand how the psalmists understood and related to their God may help us today and deepen our walk with him.

In September, we are having a West Wight Benefice 4-week 'Basically Bible' course called 'The Psalms: our Songs of Passion, Pain and Protest' to explore this cherished book a little further. Come to either:

Christ Church Annex on Tuesday Evenings at 7.30pm on 9th, 16th, 23rd, 30th Sept) or

St Mary, Brighstone (bring your lunch?) on Wednesdays at 1.00pm on 10th, 16th, 24th Sept, and 1st Oct).



All are welcome – come along and encourage and bless one another as we explore and bring our own experiences of these ancient songs together.
