<u>Sabbath Check in</u> A few months ago, in May, a group of us met over 4 weeks to explore Sabbath - thinking about **Stopping**, **Resting**, **Delighting** and **Worshipping**. We explored ways to find that time in our busy lives and for each of us it looked different. There was no one size fits all approach but it did make us all think about times when we can put time aside.

We **Stop** because God built a rhythm of rest into the fabric of creation.

We **Rest** because Sabbath isn't just a time off to take a long nap — it's a form of resistance that requires us to fight powerful forces that war against Sabbath spirituality

We **Delight** because Sabbath is a time set aside to celebrate our life with God in his world, and it is designed to be done in community — a life-giving time of delight.

We **Worship** because Sabbath isn't just a day to stop, rest, and throw a feast in community — it's a holy day set apart and dedicated to God himself.

Many of us have a Sunday as a Sabbath Day - are you giving yourself time to be?
