*A SPECIAL CONCERT will take place in St Mary's Woodbridge THIS FRIDAY 5th September at 6pm. Thirty-six invited singers, some from as far afield as the USA and Australia, will come together to present a programme of music by composers from the east of England and the near continent, all born around the beginning of the 16th century.

The conductor will be Eamonn Dougan, deputy director of The Sixteen. The music will include the mass 'Veni Sancte Spiritus' by Pierre de Manchicourt and the monumental 'Peccavimus cum patribus' of Christopher Tye. The group, which calls itself 'The Woodbridge Music Party', has been put together by the London music promoter Andrew van der Beek, who grew up in near Woodbridge in Easton, where his father was Rector. His work now takes him all over Europe and even to the Caribbean, but he says. "it will be a great treat to return to Suffolk, where I first acquired a taste for early music, to sing in the wonderful church of St Mary and to have the chance to visit some of my old haunts." There will be a retiring collection towards our Building Project Appeal.

450 YEARS OF THE SHIRE HALL - On **Saturday 13th September**, Woodbridge will celebrate the 450th anniversary of its historic Shire Hall with a free, Elizabethan-themed event **from 12pm to 5pm on Market Hill**. Part of National Heritage Week, the festivities honour this iconic building, a civic landmark since the reign of Elizabeth I. Visitors can step inside the Shire Hall and explore its legacy, including rare access to the first-floor courtroom. Activities include art and music from the Woodbridge Festival (Friday evening), costumed actors recreating Tudor street scenes, interactive storytelling, jesters, and a traditional dance workshop. 'Pearl in the Egg' will perform Elizabethan music throughout the afternoon (Saturday).

Food and drink will include a subsidised hog roast, pie and mash, heritage ice cream from The Galley Creamery, and drinks from The Kings Head pub.
