# Shining a light through the week.

I want to start this with a confession. We have just finished a sermon series looking at the church and our Christian life. We have heard about what is the church, and why church, and what is worship. And as Christine preached the final sermon on 'what is church during the week' I wasn't in church. I was on a short break with the family and, instead of going to church in a different location, I chose to have a family day. But I did miss being in church.

I missed the planning of services. Sitting with the text that will be preached on during the week and listening to what God is saying to me and for me to share. I missed being with the church family, gathered together and praising God in community. I missed the chats afterwards as we share coffee and our lives together. I also missed the singing. When you are out with your sons in public, singing aloud isn't always the best thing to do. Happily, there was the online service to go back to. I was able to watch and join in remotely. I heard Christine speaking on Jesus' words about being the light during the week. And it reassured me that my witness continues when I am not in church. I don't have to be dressed as a vicar and leading a service to speak out for God, or to speak to God. I can take my light out into the darkness of the world.

So yes, do keep coming to services and joining in together. It's great to spend time with God in community. And if that isn't possible, do make use of the recorded online services – either at the same time, or later. And as you go through your week, shine the light of Christ into the darkness. Church isn't just a building, it's a community of people following Jesus. <sup>14</sup> "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. Matthew 5:14-15

# Martlesham and Brightwell – Parish Giving Scheme

Brightwell PCC has recently joined the Parish Giving Scheme. Martlesham has been a member for a number of years. Instead of giving in cash at one of our churches or setting up a standing order with your bank you can set up a regular payment by direct debit, via the Parish Giving Scheme. This is normally collected at the beginning of each month. Each year PGS will contact you to see if you are happy for your gift to be increased in line with inflation – and you have the choice to review your giving and change it, if you want to. If you are a taxpayer, then the gift aid can be claimed and PGS do this directly from the government.

The advantage for each PCC is the giving and the tax is received regularly each month and without having to complete a Gift Aid tax claim. The same money given but a lot less work for the treasurer. If you would like to join the scheme you can setup a payment by either:


