As September came to a close we gathered in church and in the church hall to give thanks for the harvest. We are grateful for all those who work hard in the farming and fishing industries to produce the food which we enjoy, and it is a time to pause to thank God for all of his provision for us.

When we see all the fruit and vegetables decorating our church buildings it reminds me of the fruit of the Spirit, and the fact that, along with the natural world, God calls each one of us to be productive. Unlike the grain and vegetable seeds which often produce a crop in one growing season, our fruitfulness is more gradual, and should go on producing for a lifetime. One image that Jesus used was that of a vine producing grapes. In John 15 he reminds us that it is important for us to abide in him, staying firmly connected, just like branches are to the vine. Sometimes we will have to cope with being pruned, but the fruitfulness of us becoming more and more like Jesus will be good for those around us.

My encouragement to each of us this month is to look at the fruits of the Spirit, which are listed in Galatians 5:22-23, and to pray specifically about one or two which we would love to see God developing in us over the coming season.
