Young people are NOT the future of the church

Back in 2014, my children went to see the Lego Movie at the cinema, and since then it has been a family favourite. It is a film we have all watched together quite a few times and regularly in our house you will hear quotes from the film. One of the lines that is often quoted is from Vitruvius (voiced by Morgan Freeman) who says "Believe, I know it sounds like a cat poster, but it's true"

The trouble with often repeated sayings is that they can move from simple statements to becoming something that we accept as true. And not every saying has the same amount of merit.

I've been absolutely amazed over the past weeks by the faith and the honesty of the young people I have worked with. Championed by students, Soul Space, a faith group (Christian Union but with a title that the school allow) has started at the High School. This week it was led by a 16-year-old, whilst the vicar and the youth worker looked on. The teens heading for confirmation next week have made a real commitment to discipleship – if you missed it, watch last week's service and hear Poppy speaking about bible reading. On Tuesday I was with Emma at Martlesham Primary Academy being questioned by children on how our church shows that we believe Jesus is God incarnate. Some really deep questions, some real faith being shown by children and young people.

So perhaps there is some truth in the saying about young people and the future. They are the next generation and will be there in the church when we are old, or gone. But importantly, they are the church of today. Just as all of us who follow Jesus are the church. There is no need to wait until they reach a certain age before they are counted as the church. They are here now, wanting to know more, wanting to meet with Jesus. They are the church.

So be careful with cat poster sayings. And do watch the Lego movie whether you have seen it before or not. And let's celebrate the church of Jesus, made up of people of all ages, all of us learning what it means to walk with Jesus.

The Lord said:

²⁸ Later, I will give my Spirit to everyone. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your old men

will have dreams, and your young men will see visions. ²⁹ In those days I will even give

my Spirit to my servants, both men and women. (Joel 2:28-29)

Martlesham Benefice - Prayer Chain.

Please also pray, and give thanks for, the Prayer Chain as it can be quite a daunting responsibility to pray into emergency situations.

Martlesham and Brightwell – Parish Giving Scheme

Brightwell PCC has recently joined the Parish Giving Scheme. Martlesham has been a member for a number of years. Instead of giving in cash at one of our churches or setting up a standing order with your bank you can set up a regular payment by direct debit, via the Parish Giving Scheme. This is normally collected at the beginning of each month. Each year PGS will contact you to see if you are happy for your gift to be increased in line with inflation – and you have the choice to review your giving and change it, if you want to. If you are a taxpayer, then the gift aid can be claimed and PGS do this directly from the government.

The advantage for each PCC is the giving and the tax is received regularly each month and without having to complete a Gift Aid tax claim. The same money given but a lot less work for the treasurer. If you would like to join the scheme you can setup a payment by either:


