Charity of the Month October

A charity that supports farmers in the UK with a Defra holding number, whose livestock has been affected by an extreme weather event or Act of God, by providing forage/bedding to those in need.



Forage Aid is now part of Addington Fund and helps farmers whose feed or bedding supply has been disrupted by extreme weather by sourcing and distributing feed and bedding with the help of donations from the farming community. Addington Fund also helps with housing, other emergency situations and supports new entrants into farming. Forage Aid was set up by farmers themselves in 2013 to help farms in parts of the UK that had been hit by heavy snow and were struggling to feed their livestock. Since then Forage Aid has helped over 150 farms across the UK by sourcing and coordinating more than £850,000 worth of goods and services donated by fellow farmers, businesses and other charities. It became part of Addington Fund in 2023, offering wider support. More details from: www.forageaid.org.uk
