Your wonderful gifts of food and essentials have now been passed on to the Churches Together in Penwortham Foodbank, where they will make a real difference to local people in need.

Over the past twelve months (October 2024 – September 2025), the Foodbank has supported 329 local households and distributed more than 3,000 parcels — a clear reminder of how vital this work continues to be.

Your kindness, thoughtfulness, and generosity help ensure that no one in our community need go hungry. Thank you once again to everyone who gave so willingly and helped make this year's Harvest celebration such a powerful expression of faith in action.







Earlier this week, Headteacher, Mrs Pilkington and a group of staff and pupils from Middleforth Primary School joined children from five other Preston schools for a very special gathering at Preston Minster, celebrating the Diocesan Year of Prayer.



Inside the historic church, the children explored 12 creative prayer stations, each designed to help them pray in different ways — through art, reflection, movement, and imagination. The building was alive with colour, energy, and quiet moments of thought as pupils shared in this joyful time of worship together.

The morning was led by the children themselves, with a representative from each school hosting from the front — a wonderful reminder that faith and leadership can begin at any age.

Archdeacon David spoke about prayer as a relationship with God, while Iain Parks, the Diocesan Director of Education, closed the event by telling the story of Daniel in the lions' den — a vivid reminder of the power of prayer in even the most difficult times.

It was a truly inspiring morning of faith, friendship, and creativity. Well done to everyone involved, and especially to the children and staff of Middleforth Primary School, who represented their school and parish community so beautifully.
