October Count

The Church of England requires that we always count the worshippers at our acts of worship, to keep track of statistics (and help planning). But in October we record our worshipping numbers for the returns for the Diocesan Mission Statistics. These are used to judge the health of the church. Therefore we count in a different way. Instead of only counting the number of people at each act of worship, we also count the number of people who are worshipping in the church across a week. For this purpose we only count each person once, no matter how many times per week they attend, so if you attend a midweek service you will be asked to raise your hand in the notices if this is the first act of worship in this church that you have attended this week. Thank you for helping us to complete these complicated forms!
