Today's readings are Luke 17: 11-19 and 2 Timothy 2: 8-15

Ros writes...

This week's gospel passage is one of the familiar healing stories of Jesus. Jesus is in the borderlands between Samaria and Galilee, when he is approached – though they keep their required distance – by ten lepers calling out to him to have mercy on them. It is unlike many of the other healing stories because Jesus does not touch them or utter any actual words of healing but rather instructs them to go to the priests. This may seem strange to us, but at the time this was what would have been required in Jewish law of anyone who had been healed of this isolating condition, in order for them to be declared clean and welcomed back into society. As the lepers followed Jesus' instructions and went on their way, all of them were healed, but perhaps the most memorable aspect of this story is that, of the ten, only one – a Samaritan (an outsider) - returned to fall at Jesus' feet and give thanks to God. So in this liminal place we hear how it is an outcast among outsiders who is the one to notice and give thanks for what God has done. Where are our borderlands where amazing things may be happening? Do we emulate Jesus' attitude towards those marginalized by society? Do we remember to give thanks for the blessings God has bestowed on us?

Eco News

As we move towards the winter period, now is the time to prepare measures that will both ensure our homes remain warm and save on heating bills.

Did you know that this country has the highest electricity charges in Europe, especially now when the price cap has been raised?

So here are a few easy tips which you can do at home, at work and in our Church.

- 1. Test the heating systems before they are really needed.
- 2. Insulate doors and windows from draughts.
- 3. Check temperature controls and reduce where possible.
- ${\bf 4.}\, {\bf Turn} \ {\bf off} \ {\bf appliances} \ {\bf when} \ {\bf not} \ {\bf needed}.$

Our beautiful, stunningly built Church is very costly to heat, and there is a drive to 'heat the people and not the building'. We open our Church daily for visitors and limited services, but the open doors allow much heat to escape, so perhaps we could close the Narthex doors but keep the Church open signs; we could heat the Lady Chapel by infrared down heaters, as this area is the coldest point of the building.

We have upgraded and made our heating controls more efficient and negotiated favourable utility tariffs with our suppliers, and we are considering lighting sensors in Cornerstones.

We are not only addressing utility usage, but it is our small contribution to reducing climate change!
