After what seems an age, the Church of England has an Archbishop of Canterbury-designate, the Bishop of London for the last seven years, Sarah Mulally. A former lecturer at the theological college where I trained says of Bishop Sarah Mulally: "She has shown herself to be cautious and moderate. My most cynical thought is that women are always brought in to clear up big messes created by male predecessors."

Please pray for Archbishop Sarah because the Church of England is in a bit of a mess, for all sorts of reasons. There have been some terrible mistakes in safe guarding and the new Archbishop has said the church's "history of safeguarding failures has left a legacy of deep harm and mistrust, and we must all be willing to have light shone on our actions." She has pointed out that the church is undergoing "a significant professional and cultural shift in safeguarding". St Helen's is part of this change, as we adopt the best safeguarding procedures possible, as directed by our very experienced Diocesan Safeguarding Team.

Archbishop Sarah says she intends to be "a shepherd who enables everyone's ministry and vocation to flourish, whatever our tradition' and for every congregation and chaplaincy to offer hope over against "hatred that rises up through the fractures in society".

God bless her and the Church of England, in every parish, in seeking to heal the divisions which separate us as Christians and citizens in this country.
