

From despair to hope

Jeremiah is addressing the exiles in Babylon, the people who were taken out of Jerusalem when the city fell to the forces of King Nebuchadnezzar. It is part of a section sometimes called "the Book of Consolation," a series of short salvation messages, which pointed the exiles beyond their despair at ever getting out of Babylon and making it home. Jerusalem was already becoming a faint memory for them and the notion of being God's Chosen People was starting to slip away. It was an encouraging word as to how God was about to do something that only God could do – an act of salvation that would draw His people back into relationship with Him.
