Let's Take the Next Steps in Our Coach House Project...

We had our last pray for St K in the Coach House and the prayer was for the development of the Coach House. Here are some of the things we felt the Lord was saying about it:

- That the Lord has already made provision for this project and prayer and fasting will release it.
- Matthew 6:33 'But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well'.
- That God was going to multiply our resources as in the feeding of the 5000 with the idea that the multiplication came during the disciple's hands-on distribution.
- The idea that everything is in place and it's all about to speed up.
- We also had Psalm 127:1, 'Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labour in vain'. This is not something we can accomplish ourselves. We need to pray it into being.

For myself, I am convinced that St Katharine's is being held back from further growth because we need the Coach House developed and the facilities it will provide, and we also need a car park.

I would like to call St Katharine's folks (and anyone else in the Benefice who would like to join in) to fast and pray on Tuesday 4 November. The church will be open for prayer from 2pm until 6pm and the day will conclude with our 'Pray for St K' at 7.30pm. This will also be a gift day, where we invite everyone to give a gift for the development of the Coach House (gift-aided if possible) so that we can take our giving up to the level that will attract potential grants. As many of you know we have £150,000 towards a total of £600,000 including VAT.

A full program for the next year is available in all the churches.



We had a busy start to the month of October. On Friday 3rd, it was the school Harvest Service and we had over a hundred people in the church. The Service itself was inspiring, with the children celebrating creation and its fruits, though I must admit when I saw on the screen that the next song was going to be Combine Harvester a fear that Adge Cutler and the Wurzels were making a guest appearance! In fact, the guests were Kay and Maurice from Melksham Foodbank, who explained their work and their needs.

On the Saturday, we had a double-header, with a Coffee Morning, followed, in the evening, by our Harvest Supper. There were some newcomers at the former and more children than we have ever seen in the past. We pride ourselves to arrange things so that each of them wins something in the raffle. This problem was solved by one of them winning a large tin of sweets, which they dutifully shared around.

There were about fifty of us at the supper and we were pleased to welcome some members of the community who are not members of our congregation, faces from other parts of the benefice and, once again, Kay and Maurice.

For a change the evening started with a rousing rendering of the first verse and chorus of a harvest hymn and finished with Ann reading A.A. Milne's "Hush, hush, whisper who dares, Christopher Robin is saying his prayers." In between there was a choice of three hot dishes at supper, followed by a veritable cornucopia of delicious dessert. Whilst the washing-up took place, there was a challenging numerical quiz.

Entertainment included the normal range of poems from our regular readers and two vocal entertainers from Demi Williams with a song learnt at her primary school and a selection from Richmond, whom we had dragged out of retirement, not knowing that his c.v. included a role as a professional entertainer!






