September saint

September 29th is Michaelmas, the feast day of St Michael and All Angels, when we celebrate the presence and power of God's messengers and so I have chosen them as our September saints.

Angels are mentioned more than 300 times in the Bible, more in the NewTestament than the Old. The word angel means messenger and they are seen as agents of God's will, bringing guidance, strength and protection.

They are spirit beings, created by God before humanity; incorporeal, invisible but sometimes appearing in human or bodily form. According to the bible, they were witnesses to creation. In God's challenge to Job, (chapter 38 v1-7) we read, 'where were you when I laid the earth's foundations..and all the angels shouted for joy'.

Michael is considered to be the greatest of the angels, the only one named as an archangel, and particularly honoured for defeating satan in the war in heaven. Gabriel of course brings important news to Mary and angels figure quite a lot in the Christmas story. Raphael is thought to be the patron of healing.

As we come to the end of Fairtrade Fortnight I hope you have taken the time to look at the Fairtrade display board in church. The theme for Fairtrade Fortnight 2025 has been "Brew it Fair" to highlight the farmers and workers that produce our tea. Fairtrade pays a premium that helps communities of Fairtrade workers to build schools and hospitals and improve their sanitation.

Duke of Norfolk School Primary School ('Dukes')

Dukes School and our Church have a long and close relationship. Some of you may remember attending the school when it was our next-door neighbour, before it all moved to Royle Avenue.

One of the results of this significant relationship is that we are entitled and expected to provide two Foundation Governors to work alongside the 10 or so other members of the Governing Body. Our priest in charge is an ex-officio member, encouraged to lead Collective Acts of Worship whenever possible and provide pastoral advice and support.

Governors attend two full governor meetings a term and have at least one curriculum link with the appropriate School Staff Lead in that area e.g. I have had links with Literacy/Writing, Pupil Premium and RE. It is very interesting and often inspiring to see at first hand the hard work of staff and the enthusiasm of the learners.

In March 2024, the School was subject to a SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) inspection. This is authorised by the Church of England and conducted under a section of the Education Act of 2005.

This inspection found that the School is living up to its foundation as a Church school. It was extremely positive regarding the FE curriculum, 'high quality and well resourced', and judged that collective worship 'provides a range of meaningful spiritual experiences'. The two areas for development turned out to be a common finding across all Derbyshire Church Schools: Christianity to be better understood as a living global faith; a need to deepen a shared understanding of spiritual experiences to enable pupils to develop spiritually.

Our hope for the future is to be able to encourage the School to come into our Church and grounds more often, e.g. Barbara organised a very successful visit from the Early

Years (Reception class) to learn all about Baptism. Potentially there is a lot more we could offer and there is a 'Green Way' or path skirting the edge of Manor Park which runs from Royle Avenue almost all the way to our Church door.

Update on swifts

All bird and bat homes have identified locations in Old Glossop for installation on delivery.

We have ordered a double bottom-opening swift box with a bat back.

We also have a large bat box, suitable for small, crevice-nesting bats such as the common and soprano pipistrelle, two open-fronted robin boxes and three sparrow boxes, also suitable for nuthatches, redstarts and pied flycatchers.

Additionally, two hedgehog houses have been put into quiet safe places and will hopefully become inhabited this winter.
