

Letter from our Rector, Rev Mtr Monica

Dear Friends in Christ

As the evenings draw in and we begin to look forward to the season of Advent and Christmas, it's good to pause and reflect on what it means to be renewed in faith. The Bible offers us so many stories of renewal — times when God's people rediscovered hope, joy, and direction through His Word and Spirit. Two such moments were in our recent readings at evensong: one from the book of Nehemiah, and the other from the Gospel of John and in preparing for evensong these readings resonated deeply within me and so I share my reflection here with you-

The Joy of the Lord Is Your Strength.

Both are stories of change and awakening — one taking place under the bright sunlight of a newly rebuilt Jerusalem, the other in the quiet and tender words of Jesus preparing His disciples for what lies ahead. In both, we see that God's Word is not simply something to be *heard* but to be *lived*, and that His Spirit continues to guide and strengthen us with truth and joy.

Reflections on Nehemiah 8:9–18 and John 16:1–11

Nehemiah — A Man Who Rebuilt Hearts

Nehemiah is not one of the better-known figures of the Old Testament, yet his story is one of courage, prayer, and faithfulness. He served as *cupbearer* to King Artaxerxes of Persia — a position of trust and influence. When he heard that the walls of Jerusalem lay in ruins and that its people were vulnerable, he was moved to tears and prayer. With the king's permission, he returned to lead the rebuilding of the city.

In the book that bears his name, Nehemiah is sometimes called "the Tirshatha", a Persian title meaning *governor* or *ruler*. The word likely comes from an old Persian root meaning *venerable* or *his excellency*. But Nehemiah's true distinction was not in his title — it was in his humility before God. He was a man who always prayed before he acted, and who reminded his people, again and again, that their real strength came from the Lord: "*The joy of the Lord is your strength*."

Rediscovering Joy Through God's Word

By chapter 8 of Nehemiah, the city walls have been rebuilt. The people are home, safe at last. But Nehemiah knows that physical security is not enough —

their spiritual life also needs rebuilding. So he joins with Ezra the priest to bring the community together and read aloud from the Book of the Law.

From early morning until midday, Ezra reads while the Levites move among the crowd, explaining the meaning of the words so that everyone can understand. The people begin to weep, realising how far they have strayed and how faithful God has been in bringing them back. But Nehemiah and Ezra remind them not to be overcome by sorrow. "This day is holy," they say, "for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

It is such a beautiful moment of pastoral care. Understanding God's Word is not meant to crush us but to lift us. They are encouraged to share food, wine, and hospitality with one another — to celebrate what God has done.

Jesus and the Spirit of Truth

In our Gospel reading, we find another community facing change and uncertainty. Jesus is preparing His disciples for the time when He will no longer be with them in the flesh. He tells them that His going away will make room for the coming of the Holy Spirit, whom He calls *the Advocate* or *the Paraclete* — the one who will comfort, guide, and convict them.

The Holy Spirit, Jesus says, will "guide you into all truth." The Spirit is, in a sense, like the Levites in Nehemiah's day — helping us understand God's Word and apply it to our lives. Through the Spirit, the Word becomes alive within us; it speaks personally and powerfully, challenging and transforming us.

In both Nehemiah's Jerusalem and Jesus' upper room, we see the same pattern: the people of God are renewed by **the Word** and **the Spirit**. The Word grounds them; the Spirit breathes new life into them. One without the other is incomplete.

Living in Joyful Expectation

As we prepare to enter Advent, we might take Nehemiah's and Jesus' messages to heart. Advent is a season of preparation — not only for the celebration of Christ's birth, but for the renewal of our own hearts. It calls us to listen afresh to God's Word and to invite His Spirit to bring light into our darkness, courage into our weariness, and joy into our waiting.

The people in Nehemiah's time celebrated by sharing what they had, ensuring that no one was left out. Perhaps that is a timely reminder for us too — to make generosity, hospitality, and compassion the hallmarks of our own Advent and Christmas preparations.

When Nehemiah looked upon the people gathered in the rebuilt city, he saw not just repaired walls but restored hearts. When Jesus looked upon His disciples, He saw beyond their fears to the joy that would come through the gift of the Spirit.

Take a moment each week of Advent to pause and pray, to prepare our hearts for Christmas:

- Week 1 Hope: What relationships in my life need rebuilding?
- Week 2 Peace: Where can I bring calm and kindness?
- Week 3 Joy: What brings me strength and gratitude?
- Week 4 Love: How can I share God's love with others this Christmas?

So as we journey through Advent and Christmas let us remember Nehemiah's words:

"Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

As the lights go up, the carols begin, and our community gathers for Advent and Christmas worship, may that same joy — the joy of the Lord — be our strength.

Friends of Kent Churches Ride and Stride 2025

2025 celebrates the 40th anniversary of the Friends of Kent Churches **Ride and Stride** event. What started as a sponsored bike ride around Kent churches to raise funds to help maintain Kent's ancient places of worship has evolved into an event with both cycling and walking options. As the event local organiser for St Nicholas', Sholden, preparations for the event were disrupted by my recent hospital stay and myopathy diagnosis.

However, I was determined to take part, although lowering my sights from the usual cross Kent marathon with Katherine to a more reasonable walk around the parish of Upper Deal and Great Mongeham's four churches.



Unfortunately, the weather was not kind on Saturday 13th September, with East Kent experiencing thunderstorms, lightening and very heavy rain from the early hours. Katherine and I started the day by

going to St Nicholas's, Sholden to unlock the church and set-up for visitors (thank you Carol for beating us to it!), before returning home to Great Mongeham to officially start our stride at just after 10am.

A brisk walk up Cherry Lane to St Martin's, Great Mongeham, saw the first church reached by 10:18, although an extended "stay" under the lychgate and a further one under a tree in the village avoiding torrential rain meant that St Nicholas's, Sholden was not reached until 11am. The rain was so heavy that the entrance to the churchyard by the main road was under water and we had to use the tower path.





From St Nicholas's, it was downhill to Upper Deal and St Leonard's, navigating our way through the gas road works that have blighted the Deal area for the last six months. It took nearly an hour to reach St Leonard's, which I realised was a reflection on the amount of time spent chatting at St Nicholas's and hoping for the heavy rain to stop, rather than the distance involved! By the time we reached Upper Deal we were wet through to the skin. Our waterproof coats had been very effective at keeping our top halves dry, but at the expense of our trousers, shoes and socks.

Surprisingly, the walk up hill to the top of Mill Hill and St Richard's only took about 30 minutes, with the rain stopping and the sun coming out enroute.



The top of Mill Hill afforded a great view of the weather, with black rain - heavy clouds towards Walmer and Dover and, fortunately, clear blue skies towards Great Mongeham and the route home.





Although we had aimed to take photos at all the churches, the weather and heavy rain prevented this in a couple of places. The eagle eyed will notice St Leonard's photo is missing (we did visit, honest!) and the St Martin's photo has a blue sky, since this was

taken on the way home at the end of our trek, as it was too wet to take at the start.

Thank you to Mandy, Chris, Irene and Carol who ensured that St Nicholas's was open from 10am until 6pm as "church sitters". The weather meant there was a significant shortage of visitors which struggled to get into double figures. However, we had brave souls visiting from afar as Northbourne, Woodnesborough, Eythorne, Eastry and Goodnestone. You have to admire their determination!

I would like to thank all the people who have sponsored either Katherine and myself or the church sitters and at this stage we have raised nearly £700. The half retained by Friends of Kent Churches will be dispersed in grants to churches undergoing major projects to repair church fabric (e.g. roofs, heating, windows, etc.). The other half of this money will be sent back to the Parish and will likely be used to pay for two new church heaters desperately needed for St Nicholas' before the winter to replace the ones condemned back in the Spring.

Finally, I would like to thank Katherine for supporting me throughout the day. Going from being able to manage only <u>a few steps a day</u> at the end of July after coming home from hospital, to a 4 mile trek a few weeks later was not without some trepidation, but Katherine was brilliant throughout. From her trademark "Come on, we can do this!", to her taking my arm when she thought I needed some help, she was there and was brilliant. Whilst the weather was wet and horrible, no one can be un-cheered with a Katherine!




