Reflection By Mandy

Recently I went to see a production of Jesus Christ, Superstar, (the Andrew LLoyd Webber and Tim Rice musical), performed by DAODs (Dartford Amateur Operatic Dramatic Society). I had seen it before, and both times it was well done, but both times I left feeling a sense of disappointment.

The storyline follows the Passion of Christ, from the last Supper to the Crucifixion. There are some references to his teachings on the Mount but the focus is more on the humanity of Jesus, seeming to depict him as confused and conflicted about his purpose here on earth. It was at the end that I realised why I was disappointed (spoiler alert here if you haven't seen it)... it ends with Jesus Crucifixion. No mention of what happened to the disciples (other than Judas who kills himself), no mention of the Resurrection. My immediate reaction was one of disappointment, why not show the Resurrection – Jesus ultimate triumph over sin and death and the revelation of God's sacrificial love in human form? Why not make the point that Jesus, innocent and sinless, paid the ultimate sacrifice for us?

But then I got thinking that perhaps I am looking at this from the perspective of already knowing who Jesus is. Like having read the book before seeing the

What message is being given to those who see it for the first time, or even many times, who don't know who Jesus really is?

They see a man who has appears to have a purpose, who has gathered followers by his teachings about God and heaven and love for all people, and who has been healing many people who in those days would have been untouchables, and telling everyone who will listen that God loves them.

But by this point he is coming face to face with the ultimate truth of his mission and how hard and difficult it will be – to be able to show God's love in a meaningful way to all mankind, something has to be done about the obvious gap that appears between God and man (us) when man is not worthy of receiving the love and life that God promises. A price has to be paid to make it

The musical highlights the humanity of Jesus at this point – all of which we see played out in the various Gethsemane scenes in the gospels. In Jesus we see fear, anguish, deep pain at the thought of what is to come – even an unwillingness, a request to "remove this cup from me". But ultimately Jesus finds the strength and courage to stand up and walk into what he knows will be the worst things any human could go through. These are all human feelings and reactions that we can relate to.

Jesus Christ Superstar invites us to see Jesus not as a distant, untouchable figure, but as a man who knows fear, exhaustion, and loneliness. In His struggle, especially in Gethsemane, we glimpse the deep mystery of the Incarnation—God choosing to share our human weakness. His prayer, "Thy will be done," is not spoken from strength but from trembling surrender, showing us that faith often means trusting amid confusion.

Even Judas' torment reminds us how easily love can turn to misunderstanding, and how God's mercy still reaches into our broken motives. Though the musical ends with the Cross, it leaves a holy silence—a space to ask the questions, Why did this happen? and Who is Jesus for me? It is in the answers, that revelation that leads to faith begins.






