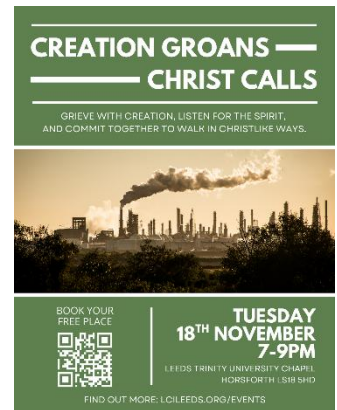
## Upcoming Events
