"At last, we have a new ABC (Archbishop of Canterbury!) Many people wiser and better informed than I have written about her appointment. This is an open letter to her from me - an ordinary priest - albeit a Bishop for the last 31 years

Dear Sarah,

We have never met - let alone spoken - but congratulations on your new appointment. You have however my sympathy. Even if you were the Archangel Gabriel you would have it, for yours is an impossible task. Not only will you have your own Diocese of Canterbury to care for, but you will have oversight of every other Diocese in our Country. Add to this your responsibility for the Anglican Communion worldwide, and your duty to speak to any who are prepared to listen to you about issues of National and Worldwide importance. And wellIt's an impossible brief!

And you will do all this as a woman. 31 years ago, I was privileged to play a minor part in the Ordination of the first tranche of women priests in the Diocese of St. Albans. It was then I discovered just how many wonderful and much needed gifts they brought with them - not just as priests but later in several cases as Bishops too. Some became personal friends, and throughout the Church their ministry has been widely welcomed. But not by all. A minority are still opposed - especially in countries like Africa. So, (as you know) you will face opposition. When you do, please remember just how many people support you. You will be BRILLIANT!

In earlier days you were a nurse - latterly a Chief Nursing Officer. So, you will bring with you your unique gifts of empathy and compassion as well as the discipline that nursing demands. These will be particularly appreciated by any who may have Gender Issues or who have been wounded by the many failings of our Church in Safeguarding.

Sarah, I pray that God will give you strength and wisdom when the pressure is on. Wisdom to find the right colleagues to stand beside you. And that you may have the strength of character to listen to them, trust them and to delegate.

I end with one heartfelt plea. Along with thousands of other Christians I have watched with dismay the steady erosion of the role of the traditional parish priest over these last 20 years. In so many cases they have been replaced by so-called experts, or had their parishes enlarged by adding to them other parishes, to the point where in many cases they have little opportunity to be other than full time administrants of "Holy Things" - Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals.

Gone (or nearly gone) is the vision of the parish priest (like the traditional family doctor), being there as everyone's friend regardless of faith or circumstance, which for centuries has been one of the glories of the Church of England. Priests are there in the name of Christ to love and to care, to serve, to visit and to befriend. No longer is this the case and congregations everywhere miss it grievously. Please do your best to help us restore it.

Sarah, I wish you well. Wrap yourself in God. Listen to and trust Him in all that He gives you to do. Here in this northern part of Cumbria we shall remember you daily in our love and prayers. Thank you for having the courage to say "YES" to God's impossible call." As I say on many occasions to others. "YOU WILL BE A STAR"! And I mean it.
