By the time you read this, the hour will have gone back, and the nights will be getting much longer. The leaves will have mostly fallen off the trees, and we start to think about the coming of winter and the end of yet another year. Christmas will soon be with us.

It's a time to reflect what's gone on in the past months. Our Faith and Fun weekend, in September, part of our Parish Renewal Programme, was a great success, with nearly 400 people coming to our events over the weekend and hearing about Jesus and how He transforms lives the way only He does. Saying that, if I see another sausage, I may turn into one! I cooked over 300 hotdogs at our Family Fun Day. It was great fun, and I really enjoyed it, and so did those who ate them. Haha.

In the Christian year and in church, as we enter November, we also enter the season of the Kingdom. This is a series of Sundays and Feast Days when we think about Jesus Christ's continued work, both here on earth and in heaven.

It starts with All Saints' Day, which celebrates people in whose lives the Church as a whole has seen the love and grace of God powerfully at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for that love, and for the wonderful ways in which it shapes our life; it is a time to be encouraged by the example of the saints and to recall that sacredness may grow in the ordinary things, as well as in the extraordinary things in our lives.

Then, it's also the time to remember that it's only four weeks to Christmas! Have you bought your Christmas cards yet? You'll be able to buy some at our Christmas Market at St Paul's on Saturday 29 November, from 1pm to 4pm. See you there.

The bangles in some cases were incorporated to form carrying handles. This is a very sustainable way of presenting small gifts, with the scarf being an additional, pretty part of the present.

29 September


It was an early start at Royal Manchester Children's Hospital, for one of those milestones to Get Dan Home. Dan went to have corrective surgery on his foot, to put it into a more normal position. He also had Botox injections in his leg for pain relief, to help with his dystonia. The procedure to straighten his foot took approximately four hours.

The fantastic news is that, after his operation, he was soon doing well in the high dependency unit. His foot has been reconstructed, and when healed, he should be able to wear a shoe for the first time in nearly three years. It will also allow him to go into a standing frame, which has many health benefits. Although stressful, his operation went to plan, and we are so grateful to his medical team at Royal Manchester Children's Hospital and to everyone who prayed for him and sent messages of love and support.

On to the next step, getting him back home, where he belongs.

FRECKLETON HISTORY GROUP

Notes of Meeting of Freckleton History Group, in association with Freckleton Library, on 24 September 2025

Sally welcomed everyone and introduced our speaker, Anne Thorn, whose talk was *Windmills of the Fylde and the Wyre*.

Anne began her talk reciting *The windmill song*, a poem by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, and went on to say that she lives in Newton and her dad, Mr Plummer, was a local schoolteacher. She also mentioned a book called *Windmill Land*, a very knowledgeable book, written by Allen Clarke, who wrote about the 100 windmills in the area. He was born in Bolton and became a journalist and writer and championed the stopping of child labour.

There are three types of windmills: post (or peg) mills, the first of which was in Lytham in 1189; smock mills, which were in Staining and Thornton (known as Marsh Mill); and tower mills, which were made of stone and brick and are the ones left in the Fylde.

Anne has a list of 42 windmills, some lost and some converted into homes.

Clifton Windmill – ceased working in 1931 and became The Windmill Tavern. Pete Marquis wanted to renovate the mill but was refused permission.

Dowbridge Windmill – was once used as a look-out by the royalists during the Civil War. The new mill was built in 1812, and the mill was converted into a house by James Dean in 1970.

Treales Windmill – there is a stone in the mill dated 1718. By the 1920s, the mill was derelict, due to the depression and the fact that steam power was more efficient, and the mill was turned into a home. There was a tragedy at this mill, whereby the miller's scarf was caught in the sails and he hanged himself.

Lytham Windmill – one of the best known and well-preserved mills, four stories high and with a cellar. In 1860, the millstone was brought to the mill from Wrea Green. Another tragedy in 1909: a schoolchild put his hands on one of the sails, dropped off them as the sails went round, and was killed. There was also a disaster in 1919 when, during a gale, the top was blown off and the mill caught fire, and everything was destroyed.

Warton Windmill – on Mill Lane. This was a peg and post windmill, built in Lincolnshire in 1695; then, in 1700, another mill was built in Rufford on the River Ribble and set in Warton. Today, all that is left is the millstone.

Weeton Windmill – this was similar to Treales Windmill. Production ceased in 1924, and it was demolished in the 1960s.

Singleton Windmill – this was near the Miller's Arms pub and was pulled down in 1956.

Wrea Green Windmill – this mill caught fire in 1860, and the millstone went to Lytham Windmill. By 1982, it was in ruin and was later converted into a dwelling.

Thornton or Marsh Mill – built in 1794 and is now known as Marsh Mill Village. This mill is regarded as one of the finest in the north of England.

Anne went on to tell us about other mills. She was excellent, and we really enjoyed her talk.

Steve told everyone that the book of *Memories of past and present shops in Freckleton* has been cancelled. We are in the process of repaying the money for the printing to the History Group's funds and repaying the grant money for the printing of the book.

Our next meeting was planned for Wednesday 29 October, 13:30 at the library, with a talk by Steve Williams on *Lancashire lasses, from suffragettes and mill girls to inspiring sportswomen*.


Sporting opportunities at Fylde Hockey Club



Many of you will be aware that the Life Christian School was declared structurally unsafe and is now in a temporary venue. Following your amazing response to our autumn appeal launched last month, we can report that the site has been cleared, and soil testing and site marking completed.

A foundation stone was laid with a special service of prayer for every need to be met. Foundation work has now begun, with Jesus firmly at the centre. The plans for the new purpose-built school include twelve classrooms, a principal's office, staffroom, toilets and wash facilities, and a dining area.



For over 25 years, Life Christian School has provided quality Christian education to the children living in the surrounding rural communities.



We are committed to standing with our project partners in this time of crisis to ensure Christian education is secured for future generations in this community, but we still urgently need your help this autumn. We estimate the rebuilding of the school will cost approximately £66,000, with ongoing running costs of approximately £24,000 per year to cover the cost of teaching and afterschool provision.
