Jesus said that if we follow him, we never die

Jesus said, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, ²⁶ and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' (John 11:25-26)

It's been a week of funerals for me. Perhaps not unsurprising for the vicar, but a real privilege to travel with people through the challenging times in their lives. I attended the funeral of Freda Smith, a lady from my previous church, who lived to be 107 years old. It was a very moving, and very packed, service. In amongst the sadness was the proclamation of life well lived. A life lived with the God she loved. Freda used to come and 'help me with the old people' when I took services at a local care home – even though she was older than all the residents there. I was struck by the way that the eulogy described her life and the constancy of God's presence in all that she did. Freda is now with the God she loved her whole life, and her memories live on in our hearts.

Jesus said that if we follow him, we never die. Clearly this isn't a literal saying – taking funerals this week is evidence of that. But when we die, we get to live with God forever. This life is not the end. So, if today you are mourning, know that Jesus has promised more than just our life on earth. We can celebrate that others have gone ahead of us to be with Jesus. And we can live our lives now to the full with Jesus, and look forward to the day when we will stand in the throne room of heaven and hear Jesus' words 'well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your master.

Martlesham Benefice - Prayer Chain.



Martlesham and Brightwell – Parish Giving Scheme

Brightwell PCC has recently joined the Parish Giving Scheme. Martlesham has been a member for a number of years. Instead of giving in cash at one of our churches or setting up a standing order with your bank you can set up a regular payment by direct debit, via the Parish Giving Scheme. This is normally collected at the beginning of each month. Each year PGS will contact you to see if you are happy for your gift to be increased in line with inflation – and you have the choice to review your giving and change it, if you want to. If you are a taxpayer, then the gift aid can be claimed and PGS do this directly from the government.

The advantage for each PCC is the giving and the tax is received regularly each month and without having to complete a Gift Aid tax claim. The same money given but a lot less work for the treasurer. If you would like to join the scheme you can setup a payment by either:



How to write a psalm

Modern Day Missionaries
