It was hard work, but the time invested has been worth it to focus on the natural world we've restored and the climate we've protected. Thank you everyone. Together we will see our environment thrive and flourish.

We have our certificate for church, our eco badge for the website and eventually we can purchase an Eco Church plaque. Handmade from recycled wood, available from Grassmarket Community Project, £90. (Proceeds go to Grassmarket, a social enterprise creating community, sanctuary and support for people with multiple complex needs in Edinburgh).

As part of A Rocha's commitment to every church in England and Wales becoming an Eco Church, they provide Eco Church free of charge to churches. But for those churches that can they ask for a small donation of up to £125 from all awarded eco churches to contribute to running costs and the growth of the eco church movement.

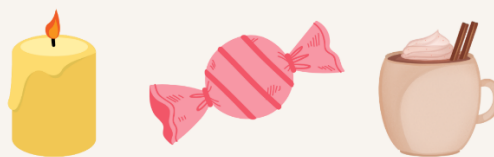

Giving to St John's

If you feel able to give, you can support St John's financially in the following ways:

Church Services - We do not take up a collection during services, but there is a box at the back of church for cash donations. Gift Aid envelopes are available so that we can recover Gift Aid on 'one-off' donations. There is also a card reader at the back of church.

Standing Orders – will continue as before.

Stewardship Envelopes – We have weekly or monthly envelopes for giving by cash or cheque. If you pay tax, we can recover Gift Aid on your giving. Please see Geoff Lockyer.

The Parish Giving Scheme – This is like a standing order, but the regular payments from your bank account go to PGS, who pass it on to the church. For taxpayers, they also recover the Gift Aid, so it reduces our admin and improves our cashflow.

A further advantage of the PGS is that you can opt to have your regular gift increased annually in line with inflation, which can help it keep up with increasing costs without having to keep changing your standing order, calculating an annual top-up or putting an extra coin in your envelope every week.

The Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) will be moving to a new digital platform in October. This will entail some "downtime", during which users will not be able to make any changes. They will be sending emails to all users from 16 September to tell them the details but have asked us to let you know in advance.

We have been notified by **easyfundraising** that the total raised for St John's Church since we joined the scheme has passed £300. This might not be a huge sum over the years covered, but it has been a useful source of additional income for very little trouble.
