

Eco Tips – Here are some ideas to help you make 'enjoying nature' more intentional in 2025

An oak tree is the symbol of A Rocha UK and an oak leaf forms part of the Eco Church logo. Oaks are a keystone species of our woodland habitats - a haven for other species to eat, shelter and breed. Later this month National Tree Week marks the start of the annual tree planting season. Pray for our Partners in Action who will be planting, that their trees would take root and go
