A word for the week

It is delightful to watch a tiny baby discover self. At first the infant is fascinated with his or her fingers and toes. As children grow; new discoveries expand beyond self to a wider world, and many come through other people—family, playmates, teachers. Thus children gradually learn who they are, and the value of gratitude, trust, sharing, care for others, mutually satisfying relationships. The Samaritan who returned to Jesus to glorify God and give thanks exemplifies someone who has learned well the importance of deepening relationships. Having returned to Jesus to glorify God and express his gratitude for healing, the Samaritan leper hears Jesus acknowledge his faith and consequently receives the further gift of salvation. Faith is a response to our relationship with God. As our faith grows, so do our relationships. As our relationship with God grows, we know better who we are before God, we deepen our ability to worship, and we increase our need to give thanks. Always and everywhere.

We build relationships with others by offering gratitude, yes, but also in many other ways: by listening attentively, by helping without being asked, by affirming the other's goodness, by being honest and trustworthy. Similarly, we build our relationship with God by giving thanks often, by listening to God in Scripture and prayer, by being open to and using fruitfully God's many gifts, by faithfulness to what God asks of us. All of these actions are essential if we are to grow in faith. All of these actions open us to hearing Jesus say to us, "your faith has saved you."
