Holding the Past, Hoping for Peace

This weekend we will be gathering as two churches and as communities to remember and reflect on the sacrifice of countless men and women who gave their lives to preserve the peace and freedom we now enjoy. Each year, as Remembrance Sunday arrives, the act of pausing becomes its own kind of prayer. We pause to honour those whose lives were given or taken in war. We pause to acknowledge the grief carried by families and communities across generations. And we pause, too, to recognise the sobering truth that peace—true, sustaining peace—remains a fragile hope in our world.

Remembrance is not merely about looking backward. It is an invitation to see clearly: to remember where violence leads, to remember the cost of conflict, and to remember that every name etched into a memorial was a person treasured by God. These moments of quiet, when the air itself seems to still,

remind us that each human life is a reflection of God's own image. That alone gives weight to the act of remembrance.

But Christian remembrance always sits alongside Christian hope. We hold the stories of sacrifice in one hand, and in the other we hold the promise that God is at work—often unseen—moving creation toward reconciliation and renewal. Even when peace feels distant, Scripture insists that it is not impossible. It speaks of swords beaten into ploughshares, of tears wiped from every eye, of a kingdom where mercy and justice walk side by side. These promises do not erase the pain of the past, but they prevent us from becoming people of despair.

Remembrance Sunday therefore calls us to a particular way of living. It asks us not only to remember but also to respond. The question it presses into our hearts is this: What does it mean to be peacemakers in our own time? Most of us will not be asked to make the sacrifices that soldiers made on foreign fields, nor can we single-handedly stop the conflicts that trouble today's world. Yet each of us is capable of nurturing peace in the spaces we inhabit—our families, our workplaces, our communities.

Peace begins in the small gestures that seem insignificant: choosing patience when frustration rises, listening more deeply than we speak, forgiving someone who may never fully understand the hurt they caused. These are not dramatic acts, but they are seeds. And when a community chooses to sow such seeds together, the harvest can be transformative.

At the heart of the Christian faith is the belief that God does not leave humanity to its own brokenness. Christ's death and resurrection proclaim that hatred does not have the final word and that love—sacrificial, persistent, hope-filled love—is stronger than the forces that divide us. When we remember those who died in war, we honour them most fully by committing ourselves anew to the way of Christ: the way of reconciliation, compassion, and courage.

This Remembrance Sunday, may our silence be more than a pause. May it be a prayer that shapes us, a remembrance that softens us, and a hope that strengthens us. And may the God of peace, who calls us into a future made whole, guide our steps as we continue to work for the peace our world so deeply longs for.
