### A reading from Thessalonians

As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. Let no one deceive you in any way; for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?

But we must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. For this purpose he called you through our proclamation of the good news, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.

Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and good hope, comfort your hearts and strengthen them in every good work and word.

2 Thes 2: 1-5, 13-end (NRSV)

This is the word of the Lord.

#### Thanks be to God.

A reading from Psalm 17 Hear my plea of innocence, O LORD; give heed to my cry; \* listen to my prayer, which does not come from lying lips. Let my vindication come forth from your presence; \* let your eyes be fixed on justice. Weigh my heart, summon me by night, \* melt me down; you will find no impurity in me. I give no offense with my mouth as others do; \* I have heeded the words of your lips. My footsteps hold fast to the ways of your law; \* in your paths my feet shall not stumble. I call upon you, O God, for you will answer me; \* incline your ear to me and hear my words. Show me your marvellous loving-kindness, \* O Saviour of those who take refuge at your right hand from those who rise up against them. Keep me as the apple of your eye; \* hide me under the shadow of your wings. From the wicked who assault me, \* from my deadly enemies who surround me.

Psalm 17:1-9

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

As it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be forever. Amen.

We stand as we are able.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *Luke*. **Glory to you, O Lord.** 

Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him and asked him a question, 'Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.' Jesus said to them, 'Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

We listen to the sermon.

We declare the faith of the Church.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,

God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God,

begotten, not made,

of one Being with the Father;

through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again

in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,

the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We are led in prayers.

Father, by your Spirit,

bring in your kingdom.

Lord of the Church,,

hear our prayer,

and make us one in mind and heart to serve you in Christ our Lord. Amen.

The president introduces the Peace:

The peace of the Lord be always with you: and also with you.

The collection is blessed, and the President takes bread and wine.

Hope for the world's despair: we feel the nations' pain; can anything repair this broken earth again? For this we pray: in every place a spark of grace to light the way.

Wisdom for all who bear the future in their hand, entrusted with the care of this and every land. When comes the hour, O Lord, we pray, inspire the way we spend our power.

Honour for all who've paid war's painful, bitter price, when duty called they made the greatest sacrifice. Their memory will never cease to cry for peace and harmony.

Ease for the troubled mind in endless conflict caught, each soul that cannot find the peace beyond all thought. May they be blessed with healing balm for inner calm and perfect rest.

Love for the human heart: when hate grows from our fears and inwardly we start to turn our ploughs to spears. Help us to sow love's precious seed in word and deed, that peace may grow.

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The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president praises God for his mighty acts and we respond

Holy, holy, holy Lord,

God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

We recall the Last Supper.

Jesus Christ is Lord:

Lord, by your cross and resurrection

you have set us free.

You are the Saviour of the world.

The Prayer continues and leads into the doxology:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

We sit or kneel for the Lord's prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come;

thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom,

the power and the glory,

for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread

to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body,

because we all share in one bread.

The choir sing, then we repeat:

O Lamb of God who takes away the world's sins, this we doubly pray.

Have mercy on us here today.
Have mercy on us for always.
O Lamb of God,
take and release the world's sins
and grant us your peace.

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The president invites us to Communion.

Jesus said: Gather up the fragments that nothing may be lost. Lord, feed us with the bread of heaven.

We invite to Communion anyone who regularly receives Communion in another Christian church (or has ever been confirmed or formally prepared for Holy Communion). Our communion wafers meet the requirements both of Coeliac UK and the Church of England.

We offer the common cup. To receive in one kind is to receive the full Sacrament, so there is no obligation to drink, but please do not dip wafers into the chalice.

Those at home are invited to pray a prayer of Spiritual Communion:

O loving God, in union with Christian people throughout the world and across the centuries gathered to make Eucharist,

hearing your holy Word and receiving the Precious Body and Blood of your dear Son, I offer you praise and thanksgiving.

Even though I am exiled from tasting the Bread of Heaven and drinking the Cup of Life

I pray that you will unite me with all the baptised, and with your Son who gave his life for us.

Come Lord Jesus, dwell in me and send your Holy Spirit that I may be filled with your presence.

The Post Communion prayer is said.

Notices are given.

We stand, if we are able, for an Act of Commitment

Will you strive for all that makes for peace?

We will.

Will you seek to heal the wounds of war?

We will.

Will you work for a just future for all humanity? **We will.**
