And finally...

Today, 30<sup>th</sup> November, is also St Andrew's Day. He is the patron saint of Scotland due to a combination of legendary events and political history, most notably the Declaration of Arbroath in 1320, which officially named him patron saint during the declaration of Scottish independence. A key legend involves Oengus Mac Fegusa, king of the Picts (also known as Angus II of Scotland) seeing a vision of a saltire (X-shaped) cross in the sky before a battle in the 9th century against the Angles, leading to his victory and the adoption of the saltire as a national symbol.
