INCLUSIVE CHURCH: PLEASE SIGN, PLEASE SHARE

The Inclusive Church movement, which campaigns for the Church to move forward on issues of Equality and Diversity, has written an Open Letter at https://www.inclusive-church.org/llf-open-letter/ to the House of Bishops, which anyone in the Church of England can sign. Although the General Synod has voted for progress towards Same-sex blessing services, and towards allowing clergy to be in Same-sex marriages, the bishops have recently voted for further delay, in part due to campaigns from pressure groups. The letter is available until November 23rd.
