Our Coffee Cup Collections during November and December will be sent to the **Community Christmas Lunch** project. This festive event has been taking place for over twenty years. The St Mary's(Aylesbury) FREE Christmas Day Lunch is run by a committee of volunteers, and it is open to everyone.
