Anglican Communion Cycle of Prayer: *Pray for The Church in the Province of the West Indies and The Episcopal / Anglican Province of Alexandria.*

We pray for Michael and Jan Gott (Evangelists) and Viktoria Korniychuk (Trainee nurse from the Ukraine).

As 'People of Hope,' we remember those impacted by natural disasters; those in Ukraine suffering grievously along with the people & leaders of Russia; and for a lasting peace for the people of Palestine, Israel and the wider Middle East.

Lichfield Diocese: On Remembrance Sunday, the Church of England's 'prayer of commemoration for the fallen' Father of all, remember your holy promise, and look with love on all your people, living and departed.
