Reflection by Mandy

"This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it". Psalm 118:24.

It sound so simple doesn't it? So often, however, I find that the joy and rejoicing in our 'today' is spoilt by intrusive thoughts about my 'yesterdays', concerns for 'today' itself and worries about my 'tomorrows'.

The fact is that there is only one 'today' for us, and that is the twenty four hour period we are currently living through. It's a precious span of time that can never be repeated and which has its own unique challenges and opportunities, some of which will never come round in quite the same way again. It is twenty four hours in which we want to live fully alive to all that the day presents us with, and fully aware of God's presence with us.

Looking back can be good if the past helps us to enjoy today by filling us with

hope and expectations, but other thoughts from the past are harder to handle and can prevent us from fully engaging with our 'present'. These can include worries and regrets about what we have, or haven't, done well. If we feel that we have messed up, for example, we can even find it hard to let go and forgive ourselves and others.

We can also have unhealthy nostalgic feelings about the past, allowing ourselves unhelpful comparisons with our 'present'. The antidote to such unhelpful intrusive thought is faith that God has covered all our sins, and that he will weave even our failures into his plans and purposes for us. We can thank him for all that He has led us through and taught us, and that he is faithfully 'growing' us up into Christ in all things. (Eph 4:15).

Thoughts of the future can also affect our enjoyment of today. They will, not surprisingly, include the worries and concerns about what is ahead and if we, and those we love, are going to be alright. It's no wonder then that Jesus said "do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself" (Matthew 6:34).

When Corrie ten Boom, as a child, asked her father how she will cope with any future suffering, he explained that God only gives us the grace that we need for today. Anticipating the future and how you will cope is like bringing tomorrow into today, without the supply of grace that will come with it. So, when anxieties about the future creep into our minds, we can thank God that we can "cast every care on him" (1 Peter 5:7), thank him that "He cares for us" and that He will be releasing grace for tomorrow when tomorrow comes.

We can lose our joy in today, simply by worrying if we will have all that we need for the day – time, strength, money, patience, wisdom etc. we need to thank God that his "grace is always sufficient" (2 Cor 12:9), and that "our strength will equal our days", and so will everything else that we need too. (Deut 33:25)

Without being too dramatic, worry steals the joy we can have today. We only get one shot at today, so let's give it our best and thank the Lord that there is grace for everything that comes our way today. Our thanksgiving is like a shout of faith to our wonderful heavenly Father, that he will supply all that we need as we go through our day, that He is here with us in our present, that He has covered our past, and that there will be grace for our future. This I believe, is how we can help ourselves "rejoice and be glad" in each and every day.

"Lord, I thank you that you have forgiven my past, I thank you that there will be grace for everything that comes my way in the future and I thank you for your "all sufficient presence" that is with me today." Amen

October Finance update

Total income for October was £5,872.10

Total expenditure for October was £5,703.25

That is a difference of £168.85 This is the first time for a couple of months that our income has been larger than our expenditure.

If you compare this to last year's figures our income is about the same but is up £200 from last month. Our expenses are down by about £800 from last month as well and £500 from last year.

We have changed electrical suppliers for the church and hall but have encountered an issue meaning, the new supplier has been unable to give a bill for last month. We have not paid any electricity for October so will have to pay two months worth next month.

Please keep praying for our income to be higher than our expenditure come the end of the year.






