For many of us, when we were growing into adulthood, we were told there are two things you mustn't speak about. The first is politics and the second is religion. Well, unlike Tony Blair's press secretary, Alastair Campbell, who famously said 'we don't do God', we, of course, as Christians do! So do we do politics? One of the previous Archbishops of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, said that in his role as Archbishop, he had to have a newspaper under one arm and a bible under the other, but he needed to be careful that he neither went silent on the nation nor was always available as 'rent a quote'!

And ourselves? How important is it that we have clear political views? I think it is very important and more so for some of us than others. It shows that we care for others with whom we live and that we care about the amazing planet upon which we exist.

However, there are two guard rails that need to be boundaries to our views. The first is that whilst we rejoice in our individuality, which includes our upbringing, race, culture and unique personality, we do not have the freedom to let our political views go unchecked. What I mean is there is a need for us to weigh our views prayerfully and at times also be prepared to say ... 'I don't know'! The second is the principle that Paul shares with us in 1 Timothy 2: 4 'No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in civilian affairs, but rather tries to please his commanding officer. In other words, like all things in life we need to be careful that neither our views nor those of others distract us from the primary task of sharing with those around us the politics of eternity. That there is a Father in heaven, the Maker of all things, who loves us and is waiting for us to return to Him through the sorrow of our sin and brokenness that caused the Maker's Son to die on the Cross.


